

# Iran Would Pay Britain For Oil Plant Seizure

TEHRAN, Iran (AP) — The Iranian government reaffirmed Saturday its willingness to negotiate on ways of compensating Britain for Iran's seizure of the vast Anglo-Iranian Oil Company installations here.

This was disclosed in an exchange of notes between the two countries leading up to hearings on the dispute in the International Court of Justice at The Hague.

The court is tentatively scheduled to sit May 8 to take up Britain's charges that Iran broke her treaty commitments by nationalizing the British-owned oil industry.

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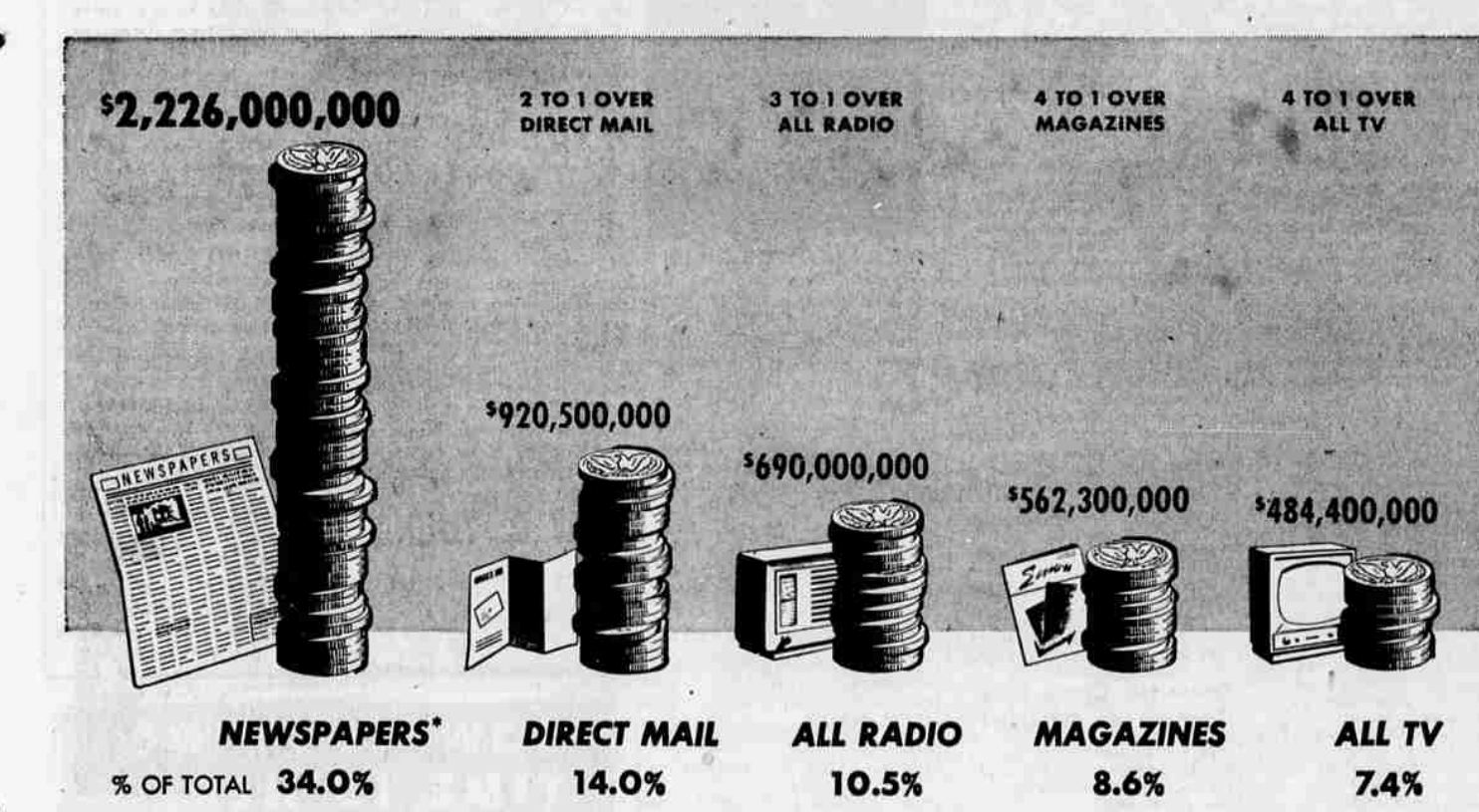

## Beware Of Botulism, Oregonians Warned

PORTLAND (AP) — State Health Officer Harold Erickson, warning that 11 persons have died from botulism in Oregon since 1946, called for precautions before using certain home-preserved foods.

Boiling the foods 10 minutes will kill the sometimes fatal microbes, he said.

The warning followed the report Saturday that two Pilot Rock men, Arthur D. Hileman and his son, Manley, had died after eating contaminated beets.
