Hugh Herndon, Famous World Airman, Passes

NEW YORK (AP)—Hugh Herndon Jr., 48, who won \$25,000 for his trans-Pacific flight with Clyde Pangborn during a round-the-world tour in 1931, died Friday in Cairo, Egypt, of a blood clot.

Young Herndon and Pangborn figured in an international incident when they landed without permits in Japan during the early days of Japan's expansion into Manchuria. They were first accused of spying for taking pictures of forts but later paid fines for violation of civil aviation regulations. In their single-engine plane, they flew 4,500 miles from Japan to Seattle in 41 hours.

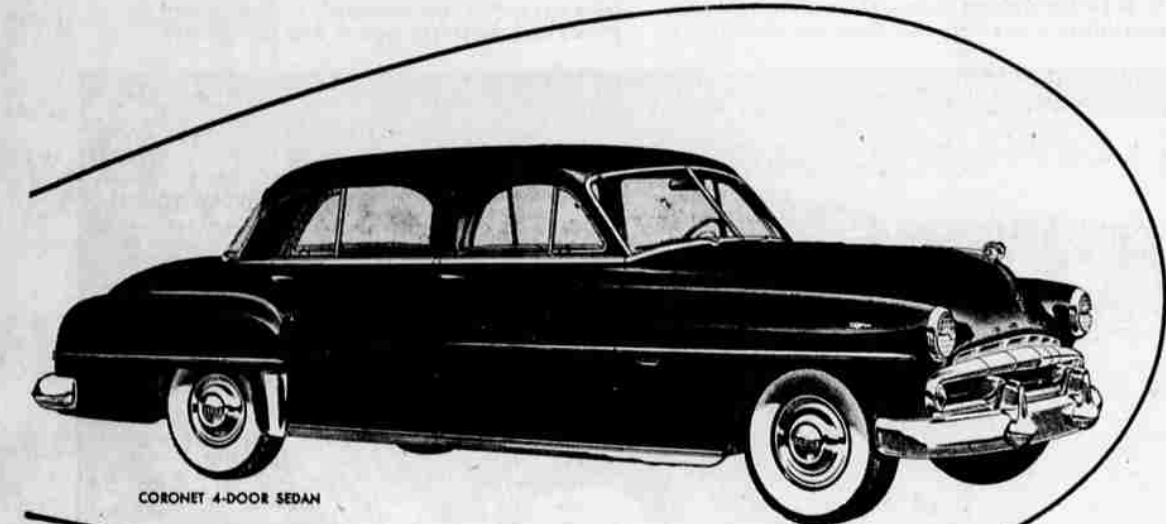

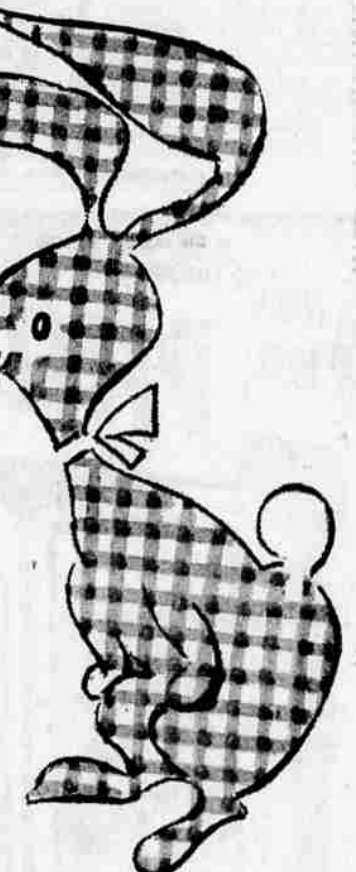
