SUTHERLIN KNITTING CLUB HAS DESSERT LUNCHEON MEETING

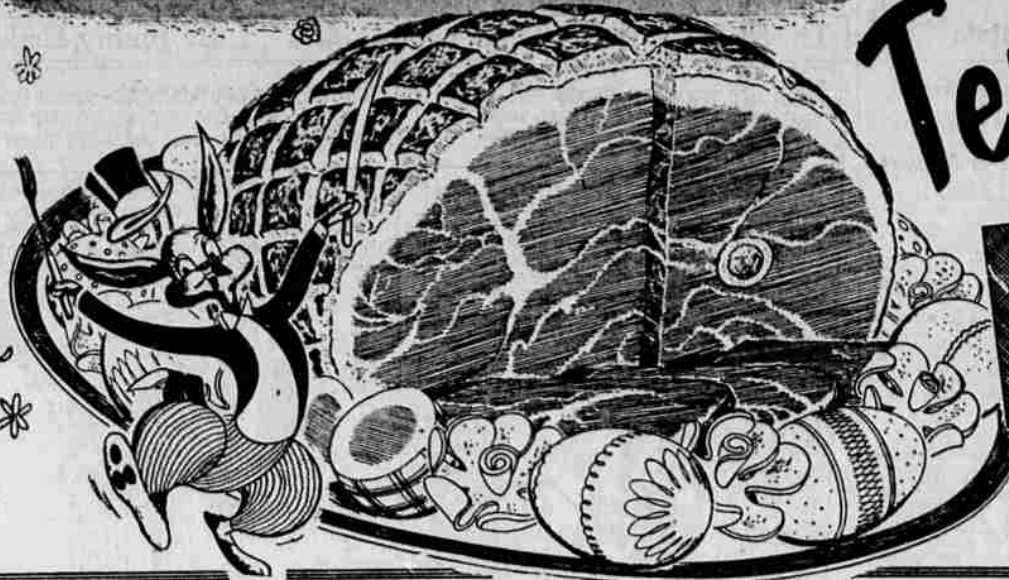
