Eisenhower Released From Task In Europe

announcement will not be made Friday.
Asked whether Eisenhower will return to this country before June, Short said he did not know when the general will return.
Eisenhower, World War II leader and a five-star general, was on inactive duty and President of Columbia University when Truman asked him to take the European assignment.
Eisenhower asked for return to "inactive" status. This will restore him to the position he had before he took on the command and will maintain his military connections.
Some Restrictions Faced
In status, Eisenhower will be subject to some military regulations.
This could place limitation on campaign discussion of past matters of high policy which still remained classified as secret, even though the reasons for actual military secrecy no longer exist.
If Eisenhower had resigned his commission, no regulations remaining to create road blocks in whatever political course he might choose.
As a practical matter, however, the battling over the Republican nomination is certain to move into a new phase with Eisenhower's return.
In Europe, he has been remote from the hurly-burly of the struggle.
This has had both advantages and disadvantages. On the one hand, he has not been under pressure to express himself on the developments of the day — such as the steel situation — as have others in the race.
On the other hand, he has not been in close contact with the American people and with the party leaders in states and local communities.

Cold-Blooded Policy Of Reds Told By Cvetic

Communist party leaders in this country are trained revolutionaries, cold-blooded individuals with one common aim—to overthrow the American Government.
That is how they were described by a man who has been one of them — but as an agent for the FBI.
Matt Cvetic, who visited Roseburg briefly Thursday, expressed the opinion in a short talk before the Roseburg Lions Club Thursday evening. Cvetic also talked at the Rotary club meeting but gave his principal address at a public gathering at the Senior High auditorium.
He warned that Communists have utter disregard for human life. It is hard to believe that youths may be shot down in cold blood because their fathers once advocated staying free. It is hard to believe the treatment of women who are allowed freedom from work but six weeks before and after pregnancy. But those conditions exist in Communist Russia.

The speaker was introduced by Leroy Hiatt. Other guests were Si Dillard, Bob Bashford, Warren Ward and Fred Bernau. The latter is Cvetic's companion on his tour to inform the public of communism threats.


