If Wallick gets an opportunity to apply his head-flattening pile driver, there may be only one opponent left.

Weaver is a veteran who knows more wrestling tricks than most mat men, and he is not afraid to use them if it will give him an advantage.

In the semi-final, Frenchy Roy and Danno McDonald will come together. Both men are anxious to get a shot at Weaver and know that a win Saturday is necessary.

Sutherland Wins Triangular Rivalry

Coach Ralph Dyson guided his Sutherland Bulldog harriers to a triangular victory over Myrtle Creek and Drain on the Roseburg track Thursday afternoon.

Scores were: Sutherland 68, Myrtle Creek 54 and Drain 28. Sutherland had only seven first-place ribbons to Myrtle Creek's six, but made the difference in the second, third and fourth places. Elwood Voelker was the only Drain blue-ribbon winner.

In spite of the team loss, Myrtle Creek's Bill Perkins and Pinky Andrews were the big individual guns. Perkins snared first in the two jumps, second in the 220 and ran on the winning relay team. Andrews was again winner of both hurdles, tied for second in the high jump and also ran on the relay team. Perkins was top pointmaker of the day with 14½ and Andrews was second with 12½.

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Vikings Win First Meet Of Season Against Canyonville And Glendale

Myrtle Creek staged its first track meet of the season Wednesday and made it a success by winning easily.

The Vikings scored 79 points, more than the aggregate total by opponents Canyonville and Glendale. Canyonville had 40 and Glendale was the flanker with 21.

Canyonville took almost as many firsts as Myrtle Creek, but didn't have the depth of pointmakers. The Tiger harriers scored five firsts to Myrtle Creek's seven. Glendale had only one.

Pinky Andrews and Bill Perkins paced the victory for the Vikings. They won both hurdles and tied Perkins for the best high jump of five feet 2½ inches. This gave him high point honors with 14. Perkins made a terrific leap of 19 feet 10 inches in the broad jump and ran anchor in the winning relay for 10½ points.

Canyonville's Bill Hoffee and Jim Springstead each scored 10 points. Hoffee captured both the sprints as expected. His 100-yard dash was timed at 10.7, one of the fastest times in the county this year. Springstead won the 440 and shotput.

Natators Snap 3 AAU Records

DAYTONA BEACH, Fla. (AP) — Four championship events were scheduled Friday in the National AAU Senior Women's Indoor Swimming meet with the Los Angeles Athletic Club leading the team standings after opening day competition.

The California leaders ended the opening day's four events — in which three national AAU records were bettered 1 with 11 points.

Chicago's Town Club was second with seven and the Berkeley, Calif. Women's City Club and Walter Reed Hospital, Washington, D. C., were tied with five points each.

A 14-year-old high school freshman on the Berkeley team dominated the first day's events. Barbara Stark swam the 200-yard backstroke in 2:27.5 to better the record of 2:28.8 set by Gloria Callen, New York City, in 1942.

In the 300-yard individual medley, Gail Peters of Trenton, N.J., swimming on the Walter Reed team, was clocked at 3:53.1. The record set in 1946 by Nancy Merki Lees of Portland, Ore., was 3:53.4.
