Douglas County
Births In 1951
Set New High

A record 1,253 births were registered in Douglas County during 1951, and 982 of the youngsters were born in Roseburg.

This information is contained in the annual report of the Douglas County Health Department, just completed by Dr. E. J. Wainwright.

There were 19 still births recorded during 1951 and 417 deaths registered, the report continues.

In Roseburg, there has been a steady increase in the birth rate along with population increases. In 1950 a total of 826 babies were born in the city, while the figure for 1941 was 245.

In commenting on the population increases and their effects on vital statistics, Dr. Wainwright pointed to a State Board of Health publication which cited the 1951 estimated Douglas County population as 59,862. This is an increase of 9.7 per cent above the 1950 census population figure of 54,549.

The estimates are made by the Board of Health for figuring birth and death rates and usually are not more than two per cent off, Dr. Wainwright noted.

Third Fastest In State

On the basis of the Board of Health estimates, Douglas County recorded the third fastest rate of growth since 1930 in the state. Tillamook County increased 11.5 per cent and Clatsop County went up 9.9 per cent, the estimates show.

During 1951, 130 cases of tuberculosis were under the health department's observation and supervision. A total of 19 maternity classes were held with an attendance of 110.

Other figures: 4,305 individual immunized for diseases, including smallpox, tetanus, diphtheria, typhoid fever, whooping cough and measles. A total of 3682 children were given medical examinations.

The Sanitation department made a total of 3409 investigations and gave 23 public lectures and talks with a total attendance of 807.

In The Armed
SERVICESCharles Glade Serving
In Korea Combat Area

Charles W. Glade, fire controlman, first class, USN, husband of Mrs. Edna M. Glade of Route 1, Box 1686, Roseburg, is serving aboard the escort aircraft carrier USS Bairoko, now operating in the Korean combat area.

The Bairoko is serving as part of the United Nations blockading and escort forces patrolling the west coast of Korea. Her planes fly constant patrols on the peninsula to attack enemy ground forces and on-shore supply routes.

"Home" port for the carrier is San Diego, Calif. This is her second tour of Far Eastern duty since the Korean conflict began.
