

The man who has given the Kremlin a first-class headache flew into Roseburg Thursday.

Matt Cvetie, the man who posed as a Communist for nine years to provide information to the FBI, arrived at 12:45 aboard a West Coast Airlines plane.

A few minutes later he was addressing Rotarians in the Civic Room of the Umpqua Hotel.

And in appearance he didn't correspond to the modern conception of a cloak and dagger man. He is short, slightly balding and affable, with a ready sense of humor.

During his nine years as a spy for the FBI, Cvetie served with 400 or 500 Communist agents. Some of them were top leaders in the international movement.

He laughed as he recalled that several of the party bosses were summoned back to the Kremlin after he revealed his identity and began writing a series of articles for The Saturday Evening Post.

But in a serious vein, the speaker warned that the United States is losing the fight against communism on the "diplomatic" front.

"The United States must regain her prestige," Cvetie said.

During his fifteen-minute speech, he paid tribute to the American Negro who failed to fall under the spell of communism, and

especially the leanings of Paul Robeson.

Cvetie said that a small number of Negroes had been converted to the party, but most would not listen to the propaganda of the Soviet agents.

America's Voice Fund, Vatican Envoy Targets

WASHINGTON (AP)—Already cut \$4,240,638,500, a \$46,680,384,270 defense appropriation bill for 1953 became the main target Friday of a House budget-cutting drive.

But before members demanding additional military funds cuts of up to 1 billion dollars can swing into action with votes, the House must first settle fights over diplomatic representation to the Vatican and money for the controversial "Voice of America" program.

The military bill will be debated next week, assuming that the House can dispose of a \$1,069,292,859 measure financing the State, Justice and Commerce Departments and the federal courts.

"Voice of America" funds are in the latter bill, which also carries a ban against using State Department money to finance a diplomatic mission to the Vatican without Senate confirmation of a man to head it.

Some Republicans are demanding a 50 million dollar cut in "Voice" funds, while a potent group wants the Vatican provision removed.

That the big defense measure is in for a hard time was obvious. Before sending it to the House floor late Thursday, the Appropriations Committee refused, 25 to 17, to return it to a subcommittee for further reductions.

he top committee members, Chairman Cannon (D-Mo.) and Rep. Taber (R-N.Y.), reportedly joined in demands for additional cuts of up to 1 1/2 billion dollars.

With that kind of backing, it was apparent that amendments to make cuts would stand a good chance of approval next week.

Compromise May Clear Way For Armistice

MUNSAN, Korea (AP)—Truce negotiators hinted Friday they were working toward a three-way compromise that would clear the way for an armistice in Korea.

These developments led observers to predict an agreement may be finally in sight.

1. Secret negotiations on how to exchange prisoners of war were recessed indefinitely to develop "additional avenues" for breaking the long deadlock.

2. Gen. Matthew B. Ridgway, top Allied Commander, said he thought progress was being made in the truce talks. He hinted that a compromise may be in the offing.

3. Communist newsmen at Panmunjom said Red delegates in effect offered to withdraw their nomination of Soviet Russia as a neutral inspector if the U.N. Command would give up its demand for a ban on airfield construction.

Allied negotiators found no such offer in a statement Friday by Chinese Maj. Gen. Hsieh Fang, but in the past Communist correspondents have reflected official Red thinking.

A swap on the Rusaia-airfield issues would eliminate the last two road blocks to an agreement on how to supervise a truce. The only other major dispute involves the questions of whether prisoners should be allowed to choose whether they will return home.
