Plans were outlined for the forth-
coming Douglas County Centennial
celebration for some 20 residents of
the Winston-Dillard area Monday
evening. The meeting was held in
the home of Mr. and Mrs. Ernest
Jorgenson.

Present for the meeting was
Lowell Rhoden, president of the
Douglas County Centennial. Stewart
Stephens, chairman of the queen's
committee, and Mrs. Gae the
Comer, also a member of the
queen's committee. Various phases
of the celebration were discussed,
followed by a question and answer
period. Full cooperation was
pledged by the Winston-Dillard
workers who indicated they would
take active part in all parts of the
program. Several committees were
set up, and pictures were taken
by Charles Kish.

It was decided that the two com-
munities would pool their votes in
support of one candidate for queen.
One or more girls are to be chosen
for the honor by a designated com-
mittee. In setting up the quali-
fications, Stephens explained to the
group that candidates should be
between the ages of 16 and 22; un-
married; and have been a resi-
dent of Douglas county on or be-
fore June 1, 1951. Candidates must
be sponsored by an organization,
group of organizations, a commu-
nity or town, he said.

Stephens also pointed out that the
queen's committee reserves the
right to weigh sponsorship to pro-
vide the same approximate support
for each candidate entered in the
contest. Sponsoring organizations
must designate a campaign man-
ager who will direct the campaign.
Climaxing his explanation, Step-
hens said that the seven contestants
having the highest number of votes
will be declared the princess of
the Umpqua Cavalcade. Out of this
group one young lady will be
chosen as queen. The contest opens
May 1 and closes at midnight June
14. Three factors will govern the
final decision of the judges: (1)
popularity; (2) talent; (3) beauty.

The following committees were
chosen: queen's committee, Mrs.
Lester Baldwin, chairman, assisted
by Mrs. Frank True, Mrs.
George McDowell, and Mrs. Paul
Hult; pageant committee, Dean
Collins, chairman, assisted by Mrs.
George Bacher; float committee,
Mrs. Roy Gordon, assisted by
Mrs. Charles McCord. The Rev.
Frank Drew was designated as
liaison chairman. Underwriters
are Roy Gordon and Lew Shigley.
Ernie Jorgenson, Jr. was put in
charge of the whisks committee.
At the close of the meeting re-

hostess, Mrs. Jorgenson, to the fol-

**Pastor To Fast While
Son Serves Jail Term**

CHARLESTON, W. Va., (AP) —
Charles Lovejoy, 22, got a year's
sentence in jail for involuntary
manslaughter, and his minister-
father says he will fast "until God
is moved on the throne in behalf
of my boy."

The Rev. Ira Lovejoy, of the
United Gospel Mission here, vowed
not to eat or drink after the judge
passed sentence Monday. The
younger Lovejoy pleaded guilty to
a charge of killing Clyde Casdorff,
23, in a fist fight last October.
