committee has been giving consideration to the rules used in previous years for the "Clean - up, spruce - up" campaign and to suggestions from interested persons of the town in its plans for this year's program.

The plans as announced by the committee covers some phases of the contest requested during the last two years. But it will remain on the basis of extent of improvement. This is a primary concern of the BPW Club and the committee working on this particular project, it is announced.

The best kept garden or the yard with the largest blooms may not be the winner, although everything will be taken into consideration, says the committee.

The judges will keep in mind at all times the extent of improvement, thereby giving newcomers and those with yards not now improved as much chance to win as a yard well established. The BPW has never advocated expensive plantings, but a well-kept appearance on the overall yard itself. The water situation should be kept in mind on the planting question.

This year it will be necessary to register to enter the contest. Judging will be on individual yards or projects. Jesse Hummel will accept registrations at her home adjoining the barber shop down town. Registrations will be accepted from Friday, April 18, through Monday, April 22. The registrations will be divided into three sections: new sections or new homes; established, or older residential section, and business district. Each is to register in his respective category. There will be a series of prizes — to be announced later — for each section.

Vacant lots, eliminated from the block contest, can be considered by persons, groups or clubs who would like to select a vacant lot, register it take on a project of improving it and removing fire hazards, thereby improving the looks of the town in general. They may win a special prize for their efforts, says the committee.

The business section registration was added to care for the general, down town alley and lot situation.

Keeping in mind the extent of improvement, the judges will tour the entrants within three days after the close of registration, and will check them from time to time during the contest period, in order to properly make their selections in their final judging the last week of June.

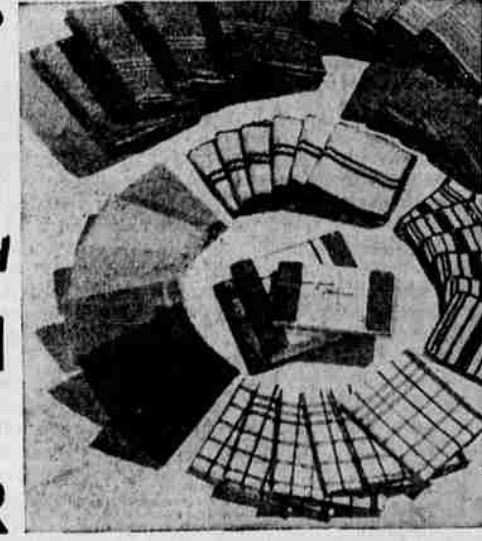

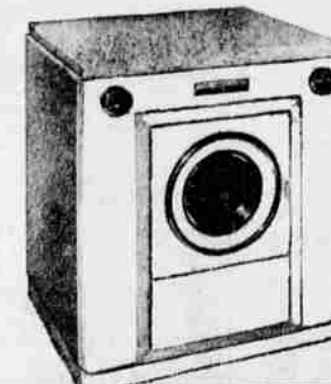
