Ban Sought By Truckers

PORTLAND (AP) — The trucking industry, which already has blocked temporarily a truck mileage tax, now wants to make it permanent.

President Ellery Sills said the Oregon Highway Council would start an initiative measure or a start an initiative measure for a constitutional amendment to prohibit such a tax.

A mileage tax bill was passed by the 1951 legislature, but a referendum attack stopped it from going into effect. It will be on the November ballot.
