The tables were decorated with ferns and Easter baskets. Place cards welcomed guests and contained the menu. Following the meeting, coffee and cookies were served.

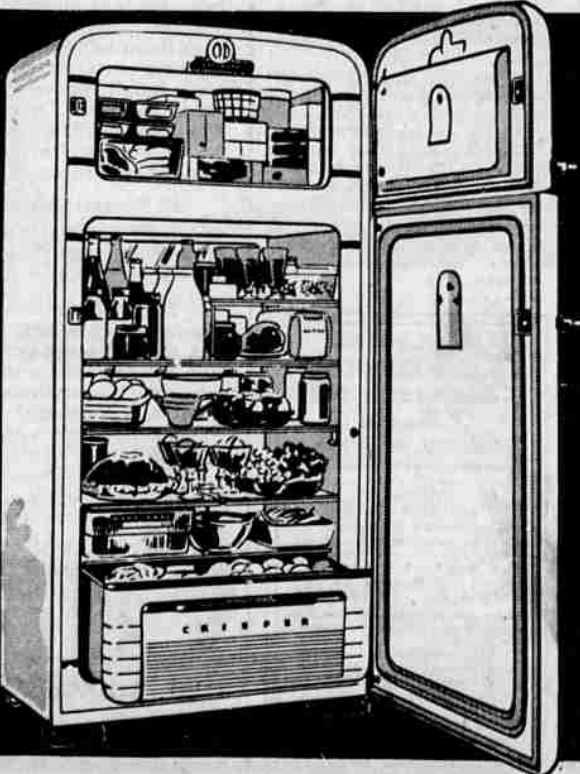
