Eugene Theater Admission Tax Given Knockout

SALEM (AP)—The City of Eugene's 3 per cent tax on theater admissions was thrown out by the Oregon Supreme Court Wednesday on the ground that the city's charter doesn't permit such a tax.

The high court reversed Circuit Judge G. F. Skipworth, Eugene, who had upheld the tax.

The suit was brought by the Eugene Theatre Co. and Western Amusement Co. against the city.

"The tax imposed by the Eugene ordinance does not possess any of the earmarks of a license or occupation tax," Justice Walter M. Tooe wrote in the opinion.

"It is a type of sales tax. Does the charter of the City of Eugene vest it with power to levy that sort of tax?"

"We find nothing in the charter that expressly confers that power, nor do we think it can be implied from the power to impose and collect license taxes."

"It follows, therefore, that that part of the ordinance which provides for a three per cent tax upon the total admission charges is void and unenforceable."

It is estimated that the cash income of the average U. S. city worker is about twice as high as that of the farm worker.

Bonus Bond Issue Of \$46 Million Sold By Oregon

SALEM (AP)—Oregon's \$46 million dollar bonus bond issue was sold Wednesday, paying the way for the World War II bonus payments to begin in July.

There were three bids, the successful bidders being a syndicate composed of the First National Bank of Portland, National City Bank of New York, and Harris Trust and Savings Bank of New York.

The state will have to pay an effective interest rate of 1.709 per cent on the bonds, which will mature during the next 20 years. The total interest cost on the bond issue will be \$9,239,507.

William F. Gaarenstroom, state veterans director who opened the bids, said it would take two months to print the bonds. There will be 46,000 bonds worth \$1,000 each.

Big Tax Benefit Goes To Weyerhaeuser Co.

WASHINGTON (AP)—Weyerhaeuser Timber Co., at Springfield, Ore., Tuesday was granted a \$2,296,000 tax benefit by the Defense Production Administration.

The benefit entitles Weyerhaeuser to write off in five years in depreciation for federal tax purposes, 40 per cent of the cost of a plant expansion project. The expansion is intended to meet defense requirements for plywood.
