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Gimbalaya: It's Unusual Treat

Meatless meals are gaining in popularity. They taste good and often are much less expensive than meat.

Try this wonderful recipe for some night when you're having company. It's different, delicious and has eye-appeal.

Jambalaya (Serves 4)

One - pound package frozen shrimp or 1 1/4 pound fresh shrimp, 1 dozen oysters, 2 small onions, chopped, 2 tablespoons butter or fortified margarine, 3 cups hot water, 1/4 cup tomato paste, 2 cups rice, 1 teaspoon salt.

Saute shrimp and onions in butter or margarine in iron skillet, turning frequently until onions are golden brown. Add hot water, tomato paste, rice and salt and cook over low flame until rice is soft.

Boil oysters 3 minutes or until edges begin to curl and add to shrimp mixture; blend and serve.

Your family will enjoy this combination of salmon and frozen lima beans. It's a delicious dish, and is packed with nutrition.

Frozen Lima Beans With Salmon and Sweet - Sour Sauce (4 - 6 servings)

One can salmon, 1 medium onion, sliced, 1/2 cup water, 1 package frozen lima beans, 1 tablespoon flour, 2 teaspoons sugar, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1/4 cup vinegar, 1 egg yolk beaten.

Drain salmon remove skin and bones and place on serving platter. Cook onion slices in 1/2 cup water and add more water if necessary to make 1/2 cup. Place cooked onion rings over salmon. Cook lima beans according to directions on package.

Mix together the flour, sugar, salt, vinegar and liquid from onion. Cook, stirring constantly, until mixture begins to thicken (about 5 minutes). Pour gradually into beaten egg yolk, stirring constantly.

Reheat stirring constantly, with out boiling until mixture is smooth and slightly thickened (about 2 minutes). Place lima beans over onion and salmon. Pour sauce over all.

Here's Superior Recipe For Cake

Dried fruit, so plentiful now, adds flavor and value to your recipes. That's why this fig cake appealed to us. It comes from the food experts of "Successful Farming Magazine" but you don't have to live on a farm to relish it.

Maple-Fig Cake (10x5x3-inch loaf cake)

Cover 1 cup dried figs with boiling water and let stand for 5 minutes. Then drain them, clip the stems, and cut into very fine pieces. Sift together 2 1/2 cups sifted flour, 1 teaspoon salt and 1 tablespoon baking powder. Cream 1/2 cup shortening with 1 cup sugar, then beat in 2 well beaten eggs.

Add the sifted dry ingredients and 2-3 cup milk alternately, beating well. Stir in 1/2 teaspoon maple flavoring and the figs. Pour in a greased loaf pan. Bake in moderate oven (350 degrees F.) for 60 to 70 minutes.

Orange Milk Sherbet (6 servings)

Two 14 1/2-ounce cans evaporated milk, 2 cups sugar, 1/4 teaspoon salt, 1 cup orange juice, 3 tablespoons lemon juice.

Combine evaporated milk, sugar and salt. Gradually stir in fruit juices. Pour into two refrigerator trays and freeze until firm. Remove to chilled bowl and beat until smooth and fluffy. Return to trays and freeze until firm again.

Pineapple Milk Sherbet (6 servings)

Two 14 1/2-ounce cans evaporated milk, 2 cups sugar, 1/4 teaspoon salt, 2 1/2 cups unsweetened pineapple juice, 3 tablespoons lemon juice.

Lemon Milk Sherbet (6 servings)

Two 14 1/2-ounce cans evaporated milk, 2 cups and 2 tablespoons sugar, 1 teaspoon salt, 2 1/2 cups lemon juice.

Follow directions for Orange Milk Sherbet.

Portland Pilot Escapes Death In Plane Plunge

LANGLEY AIR FORCE BASE, Va. (AP) — An Air Force jet fighter-bomber crashed into the water as it approached its base for a landing here Tuesday night, but the pilot escaped the sunken craft and was brought out unharmed.

The pilot was identified as 1st Lt. Robert A. Moore of Portland, Ore. He is a member of the 55th fighter-bomber squadron at this Tactical Air Force Headquarters.

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
