NEW YORK (AP) — Negotiators agreed Friday on a settlement of an 18-day strike of 6,000 Western Electric Company warehousemen and salesmen in 29 cities.

The terms were subject to ratification by the idle members of the CIO Communication Workers of America.

The agreement came after a dogged, marathon round of talks that began Thursday afternoon and lasted until noon Friday.
