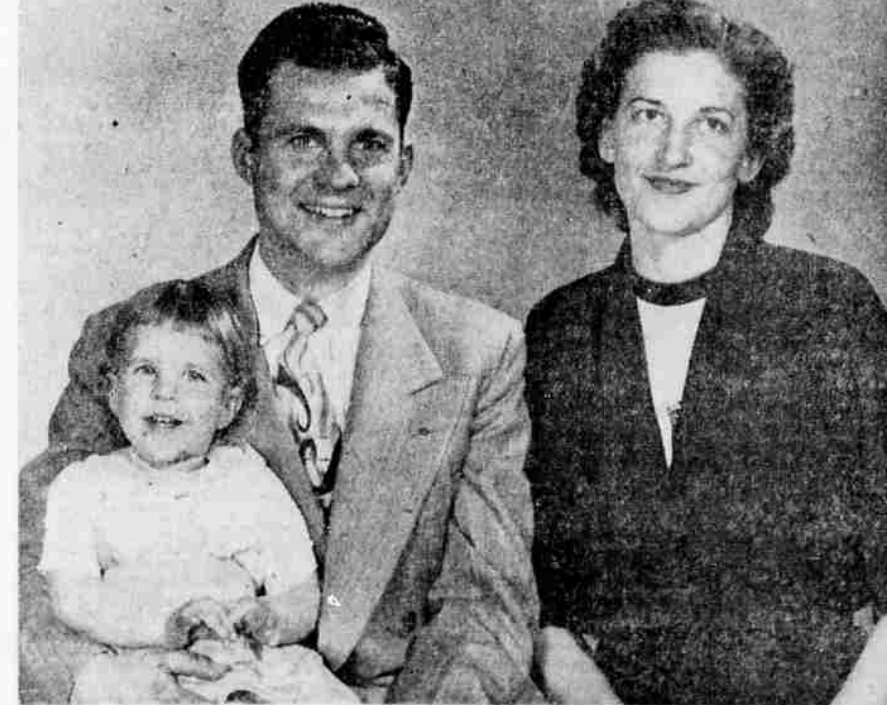
TWELVE AND WON CLUB MEETS AT MURDOCK HOME

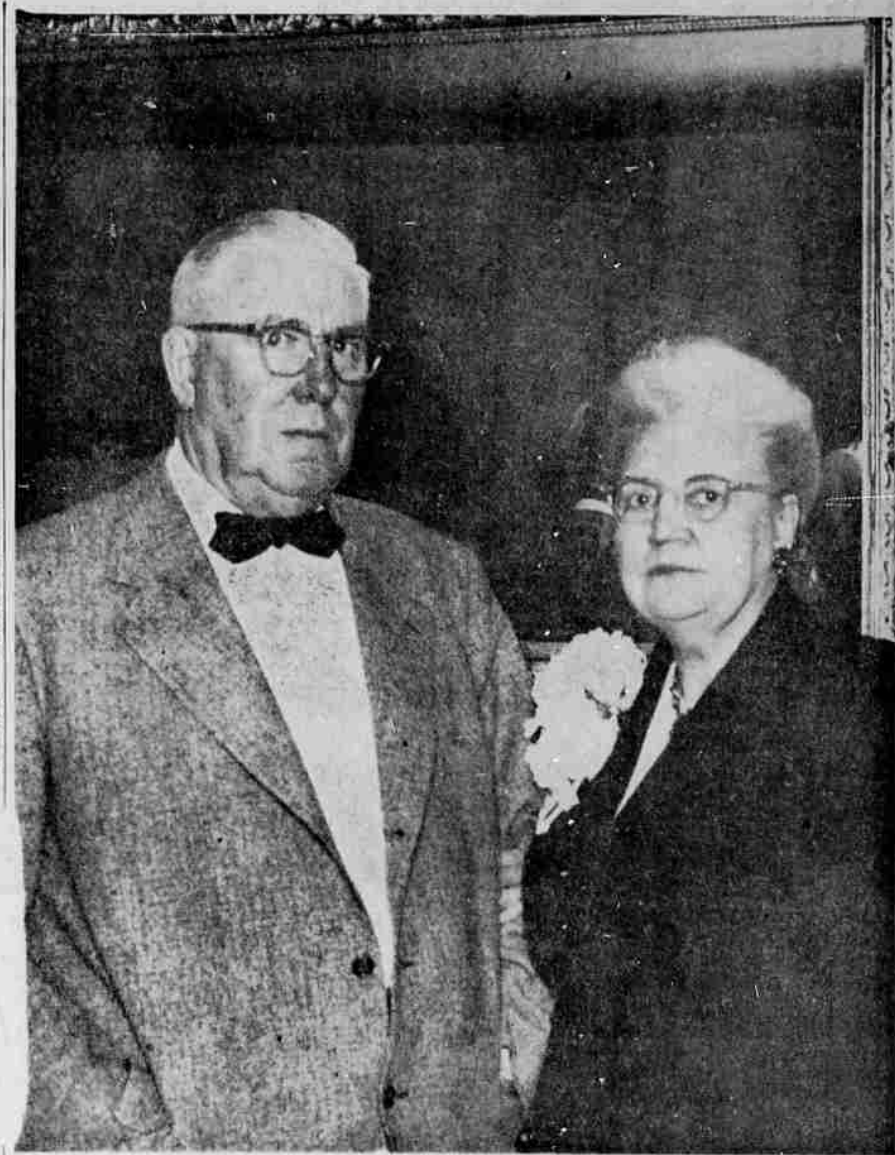
