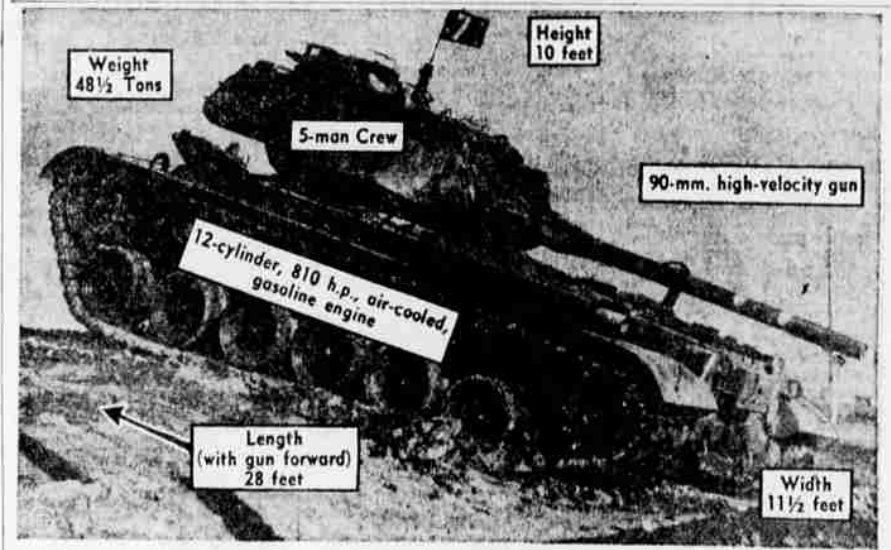

Teaching Staff For Deer Creek School Chosen

The teaching staff for Deer Creek Grade School has been chosen for next year, announced Byron F. Evans, superintendent of the consolidated Glide-Deer Creek district.

Principal will be Walter S. Foster, who replaces Charles Smith. Smith is resigning to obtain his master's degree at the University of Oregon, but will maintain residence in the district.

Foster has his master's of education degree from the University, and since leaving the service has taught two years at Bonanza. He is married and has two children, ages 1 and 9.

The other teachers will be Mrs. Bernice Smith, Mrs. Cora Ylivisker, Mrs. Evelyn Sulphur and Mrs. Frank Rapp. Mrs. Smith and Mrs. Rapp are both returning to the school after two years' absence. They will replace Mrs. Cora Gustin and Mrs. Mary Eastman, who have resigned.

Evans said the new high school building at Glide is progressing ahead of schedule and should be ready to occupy next fall. High school students residing in the Deer Creek District will attend Glide High School in the fall. Some of them currently are going to Roseburg High, while others are attending Glide.
