West Germany Wants To Build Midget Subs

BONN, Germany (U.P.)—West Germany wants to build a fleet of one-man submarines to protect her North Sea and Baltic ports, which are exposed to Russian center of naval power.

Allied and German authorities confirmed Friday night that the West German government has proposed a fleet of midget U-boats to the five other nations of the proposed European Defense Community.

Offensive Pig Pen's Removal Asked In Suit

A pig pen and a "foul, offensive and unhealthy stench" figured in a Circuit Court suit filed Friday.

Kenneth and Ellen Jean Fox, in a suit against Paul and Jane Doe Schlep, their next door neighbor, ask for removal of a pig pen adjacent to their recently constructed house.

They demand that it be moved at least 300 feet from the house. In their complaint, the plaintiffs allege the pig pen fills the air in and around the house with a "foul, offensive and unhealthy stench" and furthermore that it draws flies and other insects.

The plaintiffs also want the court to order treatment of the ground to get rid of the smell.
