A-Bomb Taste Given Marines

LAS VEGAS, Nev., May 1.—Two Marine Corps battalions got their first taste of atomic fire Thursday from a brilliant A-bomb bursting low over Yucca Flat. The 2,150 Marines, dug in in fox-holes and trenches less than four miles from Ground Zero, the target area, came through their test uninjured, preliminary reports indicated.
