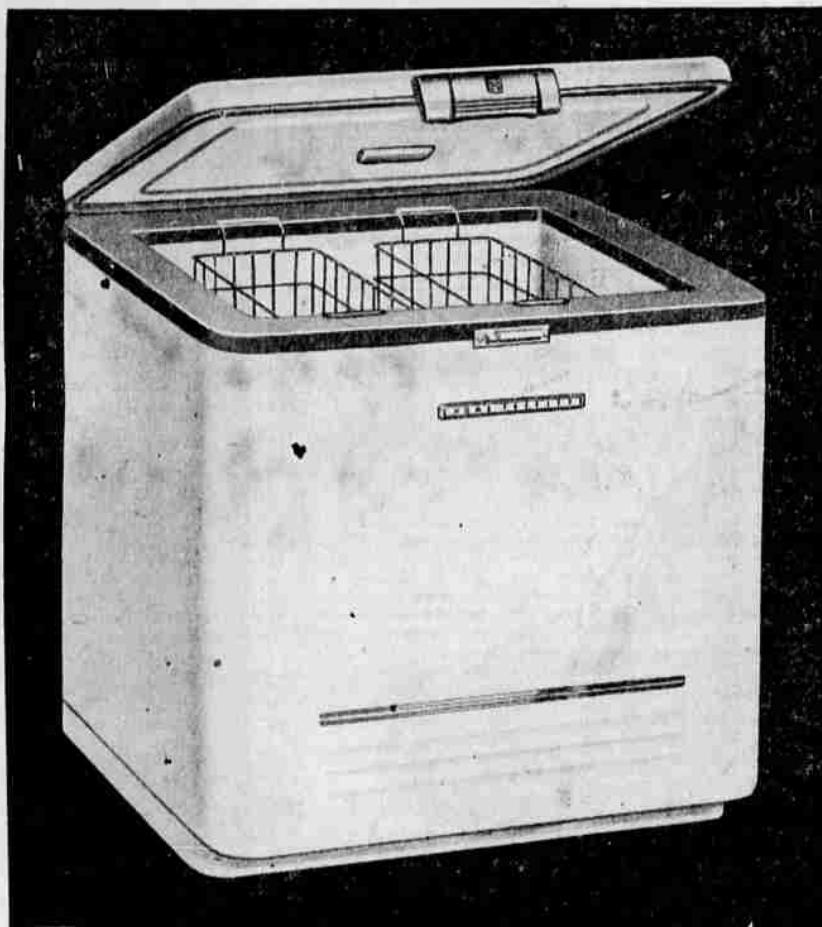

Labor Dept. Opposes Receivers In Strikes

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Labor Department, evidently with President Truman's backing, Wednesday strongly opposed a bill to block strikes in defense-vital plants by providing receivers for industrial firms and unions when they are deadlocked in dispute.

Secretary of Defense Lovett had given some qualified support to the idea of outlawing strikes in essential industries during the emergency when the Labor Department's attitude was made known at hearings by the House Armed Services committee.

Committee aides read a letter from Ralph Wright, acting secretary of labor, saying the measure "violates several important criteria" for labor legislation.

Shrinking Corporate Profits Slash Federal Tax Take From Industry

NEW YORK (AP) — The tax collector is the last person you'd think would be worrying Friday.

But businessmen say that shrinking corporate profits are cutting into the U.S. Treasury's take from industry, and this drop may offset its greater bite on the pocketbooks of individuals.

If this proves to be so, it means that private citizens will bear a greater percentage share this year of the burden of supporting the government, even though the income tax rates aren't going up again.

Tax receipts from both business and individuals in March came to 10 million dollars. But the Treasury is reported to have expected the big payment month to bring in 12 billion dollars.

Treasury Secretary Snyder says he still expects, when he closes his books June 30 on the present fiscal year, to record a total of 62 1/2 billion dollars in taxes — as estimated in the budget in January.

If he collects as much this May and June as he did in those months last year, he'll make it. Individual income tax payments are unquestionably greater this year — as you must know.

As long as individual incomes stay high, the new higher rates will bring a golden flow to the treasury.

Gross Earnings Decline
But many think that the treasury overestimated corporate earnings and therefore the amount it would get in income taxes from business.

So far this year most companies are showing lower gross earnings on which income and excess profits taxes are levied.

And most companies are setting aside less money now for tax payments than they did at this time a year ago.

Total dollar sales of manufacturing companies in the first three months of this year ran one per cent above a year ago, the National City Bank of New York says in its May letter. But it notes that total costs of doing business (before taxes) rose four per cent — and, therefore, gross corporate earnings on which to levy income taxes were lower.

Those companies that report how much they set aside, the bank finds, reveal that 11 per cent less than a year ago.

So far, these reports show a to-aside for taxes, the bank finds, of 165 million dollars less set with only a minority of the companies reporting as yet.

Part of the drop in tax reserves by corporations stems back to the confusion a year ago when business could only guess what tax rate congress would set, and, even more complexing what date would be chosen for the new rates to go into effect.

Many companies made provisions for taxes at an estimated higher rate for their first quarter 1951 earnings. Later, Congress decided to let the old rates apply to that quarter.

Many companies this year have operating deficits, so that instead of showing tax liability in the first quarter of 1952 they have "credits for refunds from the treasury of prior years' taxes to which they are entitled by law," the bank says.

But the main difference is: A year ago corporate earnings were at a peak. Now they are about one-tenth lower. And the tax collector has that much less upon which to levy his new and higher rates.
