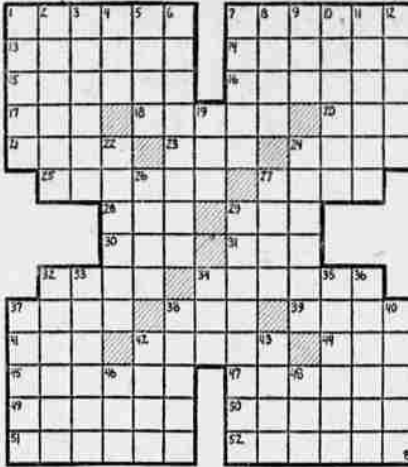

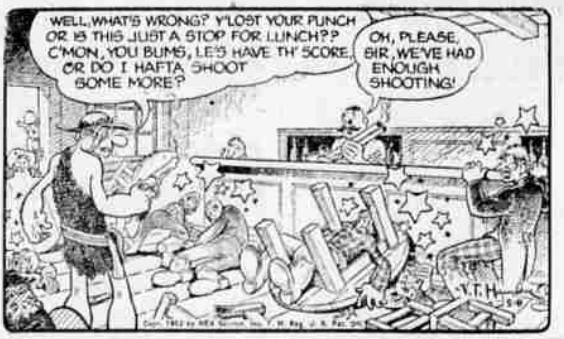

Capt. R.C. Snoddy Is Designated 'Pilot Of Month'

Captain Robert Charles Snoddy of Roseburg is featured as "Pilot of the Month" in the current issue of the monthly bulletin published in Tokyo by the Civil Air Transport.

A graduate of Roseburg High School and a former News-Review employee, Snoddy enlisted in the Navy in 1942 and received training as naval aviation cadet.

Assigned to the 115th Bombardment Squadron, he saw active service in the Pacific during 1943 and 1944, receiving the Naval Air Medal with four stars, a Purple Heart and other decorations. He was credited with shooting down two Japanese planes. He participated in the New Guinea, Solomon Islands, New Georgia and Suragao Straits campaigns.

Following squadron reorganization and a brief stateside rest, Snoddy returned to the Pacific Theater in 1945 and served until the end of the war.

After separation from active service, he studied aeronautical engineering at University of Washington and in 1948 joined Civil Air Transport as a pilot.

Civil Air Transport, which maintains freight and passenger airline service throughout the Orient, was organized and is directed by General Chennault of Flying Tigers fame.

Captain Snoddy, while training in Florida, was married to Charlotte Dillard, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. J. F. (Si) Dillard of Roseburg. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Snoddy, who resided in Roseburg for many years. His father was employed with the Southern Pacific Company and was at one time a member of the Roseburg City Council.

Captain and Mrs. Snoddy have purchased a home in Tokyo where between flights he indulges in his favorite hobbies, picture taking and stamp collecting, the magazine reports.

Timber On O-C Land Up For Sale

PORTLAND, Ore.—The Bureau of Land Management Wednesday listed sales of 49 parcels of Oregon and California land timber, valued at \$2,353,688.

On May 20, eight tracts containing 23,800,000 board feet of timber will be offered at Medford. The same day 34,600,000 board feet will be sold in 10 tracts at Salem.

At Roseburg, May 21, some 31,531,000 board feet of timber and 6,400 feet of poles in 11 tracts will be sold.

Ten tracts, containing 18,809,000, will be sold at Coos Bay May 22.

States' Title To Undersea Oil Gets Conference O.K.

WASHINGTON (AP)—Senate and House conferees agreed Tuesday on legislation giving the states clear title to oil-rich lands beneath the marginal seas for a distance of three miles out from shore.

In reaching a settlement over differences in the bill as it passed the two houses, House conferees agreed to drop provisions dealing with the continental shelf seaward of the state boundaries.

These provisions would have given the states 37 1/2 per cent of revenues from oil and gas developments from the three mile limit out to the edge of the continental shelf—a distance ranging from 90 to 125 miles from the shore in the Gulf of Mexico.

The shelf extends out three to five miles from shore along most of the Pacific Coast, and 15 to 30 miles along the Atlantic Coast.
