Roseburg Area To Have Mobile Phone Service

Telephone calls to and from automobiles and trucks operating in the Roseburg area will be possible by sometime in July, according to present plans of The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company.

Manager R. J. Henwood has announced that material already has been ordered for a mobile telephone service transmitter receiver station to be located on Roberts mountain, approximately seven miles south of the city. From that location, pairs in the underground coaxial cable will connect

with the Roseburg central office, where a mobile operator will handle calls to and from properly equipped vehicles.

The Roseburg installation will, in effect, extend highway mobile service along Highway 99 from Kalamazoo, Washington, to possibly as far south as Glendale, Oregon. Henwood pointed out. Other transmitter-receiver stations for highway mobile service along the route are located at Eugene, Salem and Portland.

Operation Explained
Henwood gave this explanation on how calls are handled through the mobile system:

A call from a fixed telephone to a car or truck equipped for mobile service is routed by the mobile operator over regular telephone lines to the transmitter station. From there it goes out by radio to the called vehicle and operates the lamp and bell signals on the instrument panel. If the vehicle is unattended, the lamp will remain lighted until the driver returns and checks with the operator.

Calls from a vehicle to a fixed telephone or another vehicle are made in much the same manner. A radio wave activated by the vehicle transmitter, when the button in the handle of the handset telephone is depressed, will be picked up by the nearest receiver station and carried over telephone wires to the mobile operator who will complete the call.

The Roseburg mobile system will be equipped initially to serve

about 50 customers, and it is hoped the installation can be completed in time for possible use during the summer fire season, Henwood said.

Youngsters Compete In Marble Tournament

Youngsters from throughout Roseburg will converge on the Vets tennis courts Saturday at 1 p.m., to take part in the annual VFW sponsored marble tournament.

The tournament is divided into two classes, one for six to 12-year-olds, the other for 13 to 15-year-olds. A winner and runner-up in each division are eligible to enter the state marble tournament May 24 at Jantzen Beach Park, Portland.

Entry blanks are being filled out at schools or at the tournament Saturday before playing begins.

Medical Society To Give Verdict On Prison Food

SALEM — The Oregon State Medical Society will investigate whether Oregon State Prison convicts are getting the proper kind of food, Gov. Douglas McKay announced Thursday.

The governor said he asked the society to make the survey so he can determine if the convicts are getting better food or worse food than they should have.

The governor's request followed last Monday's refusal by the State Emergency Board to approve \$150,000 extra for food at the prison. The board sharply criticized prison officials because they are spending more money on food than the Legislature authorized.

Prison Warden Virgil O'Malley said the prison is spending 42 cents a day per convict for food, and that that amount isn't enough. The last Legislature authorized 22 cents a day per convict.

Gov. McKay said he would be guided by the medical society survey. He can provide the \$150,000 out of the emergency fund, since the function of the emergency board merely is to advise him how to spend it. He doesn't have to take the board's advice.
