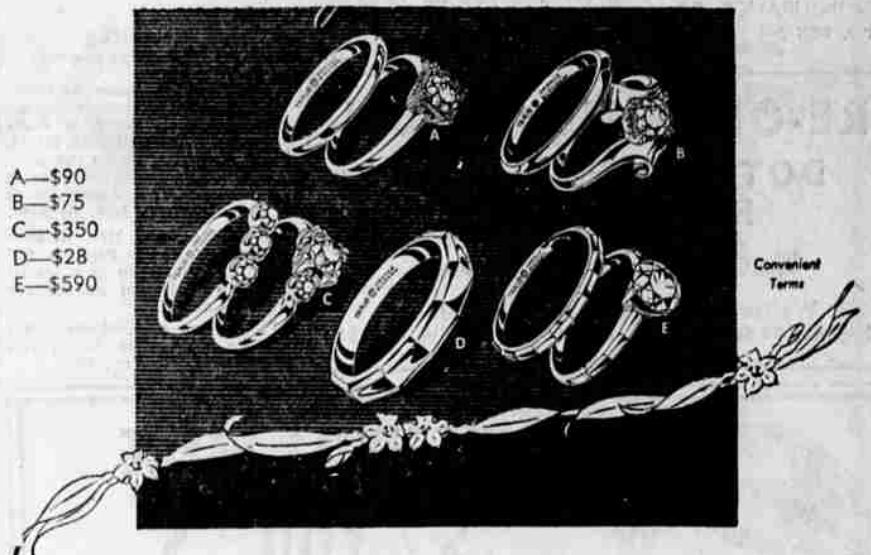

MRS. DOUGLAS WAITE TELLS OF GRANDFATHER AT MEETING MONDAY

The Democratic Women's Division met at the Roseburg Woman's clubhouse Monday evening with Mrs. Mary Lou Newhouse presiding and Mrs. Douglas Waite as one of the guest speakers. The second guest speaker was Attorney Randolph Slocum, who talked

on "Women As Electors." Mrs. Waite, who is the granddaughter of Oregon's first governor, Governor Joseph E. Lane, told of his experiences in the Mexican war and when he returned he received an appointment of governor from President Polk. He came overland by horseback to San Francisco, where he took a ship for Oregon. He proclaimed Oregon territory, a U. S. possession,

March 2, 1850. He was also head of Indian affairs of the territory, which at that time included Oregon, Washington, Idaho, Western Montana and Wyoming. His final resting place is in the Masonic cemetery.

Attorney Slocum mentioned the value of education in citizenship. Mrs. Elizabeth Warg, sang two solos.
