raises the WSB recommended for the CIO Steelworkers and for its endorsement of a union shop in the industry.

Under a union shop agreement, a non-union worker may be hired but he must join a union within a specified time.

The organization proposal, presented by Sen. Dirksen (R-Ill.), does not say how many members the board should have. Their appointment would be subject to Senate confirmation. Present board appointments are not.

The new board could formulate and recommend to the economic stabilizer general policies and rules on wages.

**Price Raise Ban Asked**  
The committee instructed its staff to draw up an amendment to specify that the Capehart amendment to the controls law applies only to manufacturers and not to retailers.

The Capehart provision says price ceilings must allow for increased costs from the start of the Korean war to last July 26.

The proposed amendment to the Capehart section was requested by the Office of Price Stabilization. It said otherwise prices would have to be raised on a long list of goods as result of an emergency Court of Appeals ruling last week that Capehart applies to retailers as well as to manufacturers.
