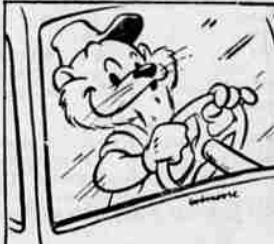

Ex-Governor Sprague Gives Nod To Warren

SALEM — Publisher Charles Sprague of the Oregon Statesman Sunday will endorse Gov. Earl Warren of California for President. Sprague at the same time will say in his newspaper column there is a strong possibility that Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower will win the Republican presidential nomination. "But," the publisher and former governor will add, "in Governor Warren we have a neighbor who has demonstrated his capacity in civil administration, his vote-getting ability and his balance of judgment on political issues, so he gets our endorsement." The present governor, Douglas McKay, is backing Eisenhower.

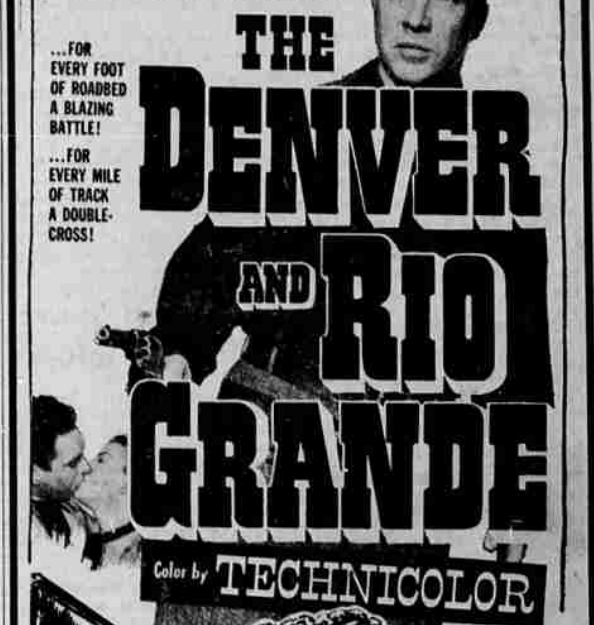

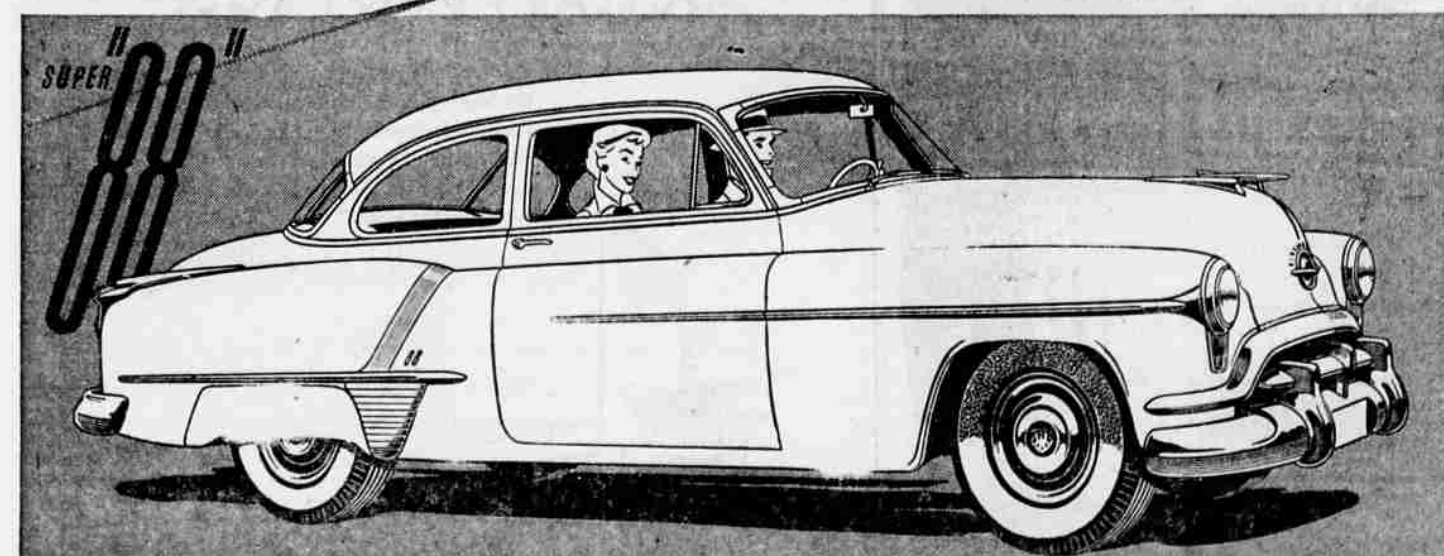
