about any difficulty, they are going to find the remedy."

"I want to be President of the United States," the senator said, "because there are many things I want to see done. I want the nation's spiritual and economic strength used in the interests of peace and justice."

"I want our tax dollars used for our own development instead of for war," he continued.

The future course of events in the world are going to be determined in the next four or five years, Kefauver declared. The foremost question, he explained, is whether the U.S. is going to be able to furnish the leadership to prevent war.

Adding that he didn't believe war is inevitable, he suggested support of the United Nations and for the free nations "stand united against the Communist aggressor."

The evil men of the Kremlin will think a long, long time before they go into war because they know they cannot win," Kefauver said, drawing a round of applause.

**Bunyans On Job**

The senator was "abducted" following his address by a group of axe-toting Paul Bunyans — his third such abduction since beginning his campaign in Oregon.

Before the Bunyans let him go, they drew the campaign promise that if elected, he'd appoint Albert G. Fiegel, Roseburg's Democratic mayor, as ambassador to London.

Mayor Fiegel introduced the speaker. Several Democratic Party officials and candidates accompanied the senator here. Kefauver left last night for San Francisco and later for Washington, D. C.
