Mayor J. C. Kesner of Sutherland announced that bids for the construction of water works improvements for the city will be accepted until 7:30 p. m. May 26.

The work includes a new intake structure at the dam, and a new pump house. The pump house will have a concrete base and floor and a wooden superstructure. The intake structure and pump house will require about 120 yards of concrete and 12,000 pounds of reinforcing steel.

Other work includes installation of pumps and piping. The equipment has been purchased by the city and is now on hand.
