Open House Set At Vets Hospital On Sunday P.M.

Sunday between 2 and 4 p.m. will be celebrated as Hospital Day at the Roseburg Veterans Hospital. Dr. John L. Haskins reminded the people of Douglas County today. Hospitals all over the nation select one day in the middle of May on which to honor the birth of Florence Nightingale, who is sometimes called the founder of nursing as an occupation and profession. On this day the general public is taken on tours of the hospital so that the real inside program of the care and treatment of the veteran can be revealed and explained. The Veterans Administration boasts that they render to veteran patients hospital care that is "second to none," so welcome the opportunity to show what that care consists of, said Dr. Haskins.

"Mental hospitals are no longer properly called asylums or to be considered merely as places of refuge, but are in fact hospitals where scientific methods of treatment are used to rehabilitate their patients and return them in the shortest possible time to useful lives as ordinary citizens," Dr. Haskins emphasized. "In line with the advance in treatment has come about the idea that these places are places where one can visit and see what can be done and what is being done for mental patients. We cannot show you the various methods of shock therapy or the surgeon doing a lobotomy, but we can show you some of the results of these modern methods of treatment."

Besides the visits to the wards, visitors will be conducted through the dental clinic, x-ray rooms, laboratories, physical therapy department, occupational therapy shops, and the recreation sections. There will be a sale of products of the occupational therapy shops in the lobby of the administration building during the afternoon. These articles will consist mostly of rugs and a few pieces of leather handcraft work. Musical entertainment will be supplied by the Knights of Pythias Girls Drum Corps and by the hospital patients' orchestra. Light refreshments will be served at the end of each tour. Tours will start at 2 o'clock and continue at intervals until 4.
