

Ben Hogan Wins Colonial National

PORT WORTH, Tex. (AP) — Ben Hogan banked \$4,000 first money from the \$20,000 Colonial National invitation golf tournament Monday and looked toward defense of his championship in the National Open.

Little Ben's stretch drive in which he shot a virtually perfect round of three-under-par 67 netted him his third Colonial title in the six years of this tournament Sunday. He wound up with 279 for 72 holes, beating out Lloyd Mangrum of Chicago by four strokes in the fight for top money.

Salveson Pitches 3 In Running 200th PCL Win For Bad Luck Mound Prize

Big Jack Salveson has become the eleventh Pacific Coast League pitcher to win 200 games.

The veteran 38-year-old right hander — he's pitched for every PCL club except San Francisco and Seattle — finally achieved his goal Sunday night by tossing a four-hitter in the seven-inning finale of the San Diego-Oakland doubleheader.

The Padres drubbed Oakland twice 6-2 and 6-1. Although Salveson fanned only one batter, he fed the rest pitches that made easy work for the fielders.

Elsewhere around the loop Seattle beat Hollywood 2-1 then was snowed under 12-2. Portland and San Francisco split, the Beavers taking the opener 7-2 then bowing 2-1. Los Angeles snapped a four

game losing streak by twice defeating Sacramento, 3-2 and 9-1.

There are no games Monday. The series starting Tuesday finds Seattle at Sacramento, Los Angeles at San Francisco, Oakland at Hollywood and Portland at San Diego.

At Seattle outfielder Carlos Bernier got two singles, a double and a triple and scored four runs to lead Hollywood to victory in the nightcap. Monty Bagsall, who followed him in the batting order, batted in five runs. Hollywood's six run rally in the fourth cracked the game open. In all, four pitchers worked for the losers.

Mel Queen and Art DeDuca both went the route in the opener, with DeDuca tossing a smooth five-hitter at the Stars. Queen allowed six safeties. Seattle's winning run came in the eighth on a single, a sacrifice and Bob Boyd's sizzling single through the pitcher's box.

California Crew Looms As Olympic Contestant

NEWPORT HARBOR, Calif. (AP) — The University of California crew loomed stronger as a possible U. S. representative in the Olympic Games Monday following a decisive victory in the finals of the Western Intercollegiate Sprint Rowing Championships on Saturday.

The Golden Bears rowed the 2,000-meter Olympic distance in 6:46.8 to win by more than four lengths over Stanford which finished in 7:04.8.

In the preliminaries, California won its heat easily from Oregon State and UCLA while Stanford beat British Columbia and the University of Southern California without being pressed.

Art Houtteman, Murry Dickson and Bob Hooper are running neck-and-neck for hard-luck-of-the-year hurling honors.

At the moment, Houtteman is in the fore. The young Detroit twirler dropped a heart-breaker Sunday losing a 1-0 decision to Marv Grissom as the Chicago White Sox twice shut out Detroit. Veteran Joe Bobson outpitched Virgil Trucks, 3-0, in the first game of the doubleheader.

Hooper also went down 1-0 as the Philadelphia Athletics were held to a split by Washington. The A's drew first blood, defeating the Senators, 2-1, as Bobby Shantz turned in a six-hitter to become the first American League pitcher to win seven games. Lefty Lou Slater got Washington even, however, edging out Hooper at the ninth when Pete Runnels drove in the only run of the game with a single that scored Jim Busby.

Dickson, Pittsburgh's gritty right hander, was within one out of registering his first triumph since April 30 — and only his second of the year — but a two-out home run by Dee Fondy with a man on base in the ninth inning dashed Murry's hopes. The blow came off Dickson's reliever, Ted Wilks, and gave the Chicago Cubs a 5-4 win over the Pirates.

Cleveland earned a split with the St. Louis Browns, winning the nightcap, 6-2, after Rogers Hornsby's men had taken the opener, 7-5. The split left the front-running Indians still three games ahead of Washington and the Boston Red Sox, now tied for second place.

In the only other action, the St. Louis Cardinals defeated the Cincinnati Reds, 7-6, when Tommy Glaviano drove home Del Rice with a double in the seventh inning. Rain washed out the second game. The elements also postponed games between the New York Yankees and Red Sox, Brooklyn and Philadelphia and the Boston Braves and New York Giants.

Dick Yost Captures Pendleton Golf Title

PENDLETON, Ore. (AP) — A five-under-par 30 on the last nine gave Portland amateur Dick Yost a 72-hole total of 272 Sunday and the Pendleton Open golf championship.

Yost was eight-under-par for the 72 holes and five strokes under Bud Ward, Great Falls, Mont., professional, who finished second. Ward picked up \$300 of the \$2,000 prize money for his effort.



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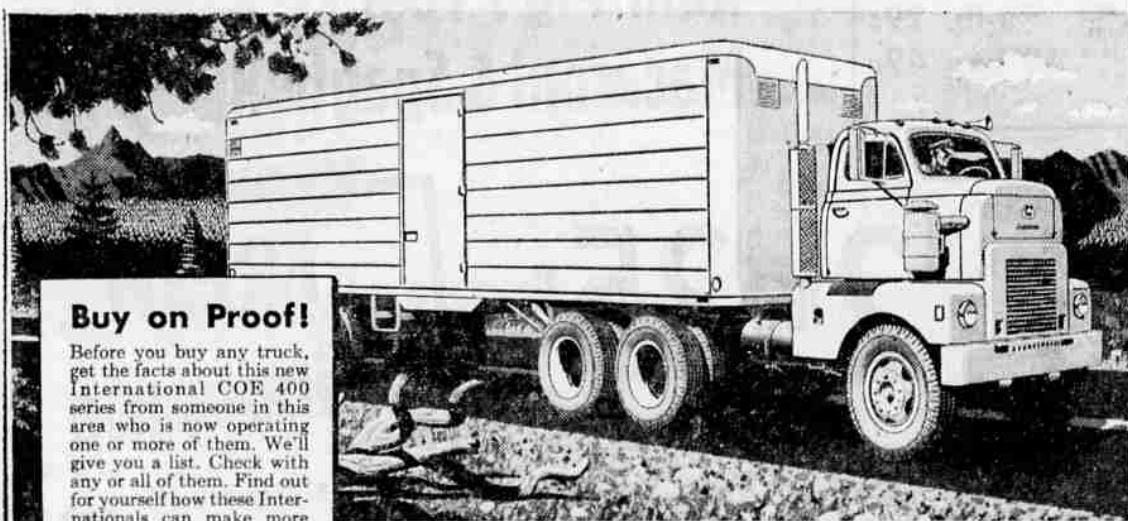
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
