**General Clark
Cracks Down
On Red POWs**

TOKYO (AP) — Gen. Mark Clark said Friday he had given orders to the U. S. 8th Army "to obtain uncontestable control" of the United Nations prisoner of war camps at Pusan and Koje Island.

"The hard core of the rebellious leaders at Pusan already have been isolated from the other prisoners," the United Nations commander said in his first interview since taking over from Gen. Matthew B. Ridgway.

When Clark assumed command May 12 he learned the Communist prisoners in the compounds were running the camps almost to suit themselves. Several riots had to be put down by force.

The prisoner's flagrant disregard of our instructions will not be tolerated any longer," Clark said.

"It was an intolerable situation. The prisoners of war have certain obligations and we expect them to comply. It was in furtherance of this policy that I ordered the 18th Airborne Regiment to Koje Island."

Clark expressed hope the POW's would "comply with our instructions so that force won't be necessary."

But if they do not, he added, Gen. James A. Van Fleet, Eighth Army commander, has ordered guards to use concussion grenades, tear gas and riot squad tactics.

Toy Gun Woman Assured Money For Operation

NEW YORK (AP) — Mrs. Anne Myers, who stuck up a bank with a toy pistol in an attempt to get \$400 for an operation, learned Friday she would get all the money she needed for medical treatment.

The tiny, 34-year-old mother was arraigned in felony court on three charges in connection with her try as a bank robber.

As the hearing began, an attorney said a New York night club owner had promised to take care of Mrs. Myers' medical expenses and give her a job when she got out of the hospital.

The attorney, Nicholas Iannuzzi, said he represented Samuel Fuchs, owner of Sammy's Bowery Follies.

He put up a \$500 bond for Mrs. Myers' release, pending grand jury action, and waiving examination, said he would put her before the grand jury to tell her own story.

Needed For Operation

The five-foot, 81-pound woman spent all of 15 minutes Thursday in her role as bank robber — most of it trying vainly to escape with the \$400 she had obtained at the point of her toy pistol.

She said later that doctors told her she needed that amount for an operation.

She had entered the Corn Exchange Bank Trust Co. branch at Broadway and 91st street, pulled out her "gun" and handed a woman-cashier a scribbled note which said:

"There's a gun pointed at you. Hand me exactly \$400 and don't make a sound."

She was captured after a four-block chase.
