## Pine Workers Union, Operators Sign Pact

KLAMATH FALLS (AP)—The Pine Industrial Relations Committee, an employer group representing 78 Oregon and Northern California mills, and the AFL Lumber and Sawmill Workers' Union have agreed on new contracts.

One contract covers the union's Northern California District Council. It provides for a 10-cent hourly pay increase, a 2-cent increase in night differential and an improved vacation clause. Some 3,500 workers in 33 mills are covered by the contract.

The other agreement is with the Central Oregon and Klamath Basin District Councils. It provides for a 12 1/2-cent hourly pay increase for 4,175 workers in 25 mills.

Miss Florence Beardsley, director of elementary education for the state, discussed the "Standard School" in the main address at the exercises.

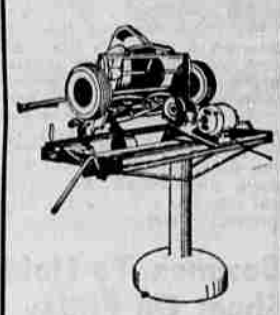
Louis Price, principal, presented the class and Eugene Fisher, chairman of the board of education, handed out diplomas.
