Repeated blows, injuries and prolonged irritation from overuse of certain parts will cause the bursae to swell and become inflamed. Shoulder pains are usually caused by inflammation of a sac situated beneath the shoulder or deltoid muscle and may be caused by an infection somewhere in the body. More often there has been an overuse of the shoulder, such as cleaning windows or ceiling or other overhead work. Very often, the victim will go to bed feeling perfectly well and wake up with a painful and lame shoulder. Being overheated and cooling off too suddenly was probably the cause. Thereafter, the individual finds it impossible to find a comfortable position during sleep.

The Federal Civil Defense Administration said it plans to send 10 to 30 miles of pipe to each of 32 undisclosed locations in the nation this year. The exact quantity varies with the industrial concentration and population of each area.

SAN FRANCISCO — Bruce Hopping, millionaire seaman awaiting a bad conduct discharge for inciting "verbal mutiny" among fellow shipmates, was pushing a broom and still sounding off Saturday against his pet peeve—the Navy. The 30-year-old reservist, who received national publicity when he tried to tell the admirals how to run the Navy, arrived at Treasure Island Friday to await review in Washington, D. C., of his conviction May 16 by a general court martial board.

ASTORIA — A protest has been made by flour mill workers here against the shipment of wheat, instead of flour, to Japan. Matt Meehan, Portland, representative of the International Longshoremen's and Warehousemen's Union, with which the mill workers are affiliated, sent the protest to Sen. Wayne Morse of Oregon. He said the American wheat would be ground in Japan and sold to former U. S. flour customers in Asia. Meehan said that flour mill production had been curtailed here.
