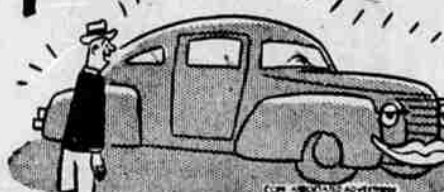

Cooperation Held Vital To Science Advancement

Young engineers must realize that progress in science comes not from a few prima donnas, but from the cooperative interdependence of many trained minds working toward common objectives.

This is the truism brought out in a movie presented at the regular Thursday meeting of the Rotary Club at the Umpqua Hotel. The movie, "Mr. Bell," was a narrative of the life of Alexander Graham Bell. It was filmed as an observance of the inventor's 100th birthday, and the 75th anniversary of the invention of the telephone.

The picture portrayed young Bell as a Boston teacher in the gaslight era. His interest in science, particularly the problem of hearing, led him to seek improvement on the telephone. Following Bell's career, the movie depicted the dramatic experiments which led to the famous invention that bears his name. He faced, however, the "doubting Thomases of finance." Many jeeringly belittled his efforts until the invention was developed.

Bell, however, was a visionary who saw the telephone not as an amusing toy but as a common tool of society. He envisioned the motion picture, radar, sonar and inventions for the deaf.

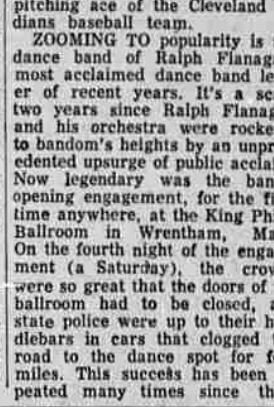
