Appeal To Dodge Execution Lost By Oregon Killer

SALEM (AP) — The Oregon Supreme Court ruled Wednesday that Frank Oliver Payne, 49, must die in the state's lethal gas chamber for the holdup slaying in Portland of H. Nathan Butler, grocery store owner, Jan. 7, 1951.

Payne argued that the 1929 constitutional amendment restoring the death penalty was illegal. The high court, in its decision by Justice Earl C. Latourette, ruled again that the state has the right to inflict the death penalty.

Payne never denied that he committed the murder. He will be taken back to Circuit Court in Multnomah County for resentencing.

Payne is one of three men at the state penitentiary who are awaiting execution.

The others are Wayne Long, whose conviction was upheld several days ago by the court; and Morris Leland, who is appealing to the United States Supreme Court.

Long killed a man to steal his truck in order to obtain a getaway vehicle for a Portland bank holdup. Leland killed a 15-year-old girl in Portland.
