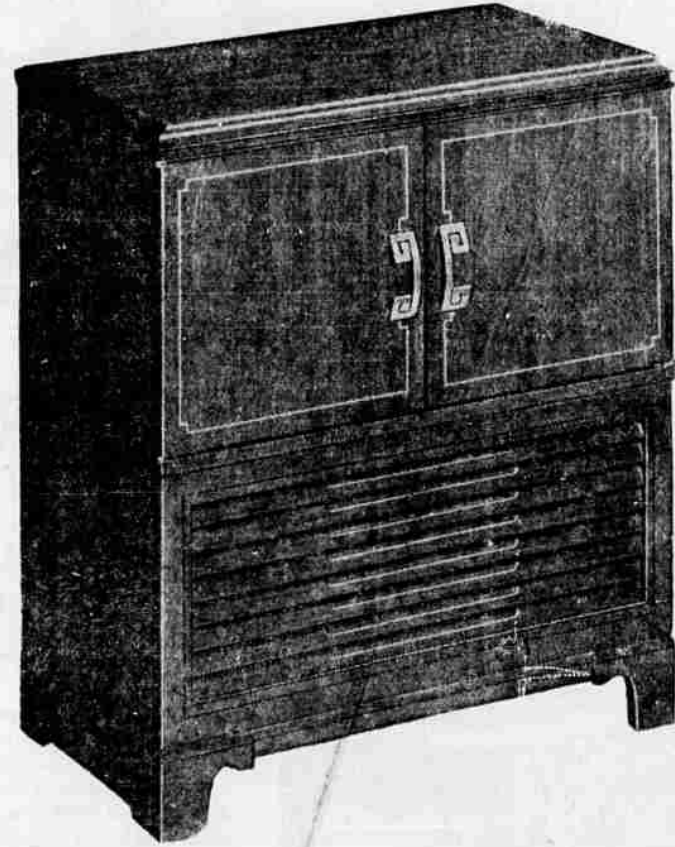

Communist Call For Strike Turns Into Huge Flop

PARIS (AP) — A Red attempt to paralyze the French nation with a sit-down strike turned into a resounding flop Wednesday.

Premier Antoine Pinay, a shy but determined small businessman, met the newest Communist attack head on.

He gave orders to thousands of steel-helmeted policemen and gendarmes, many armed with tear gas bombs and masks, to mobilize throughout the country and let the Communist-led unionists strike—if they did it peacefully.
