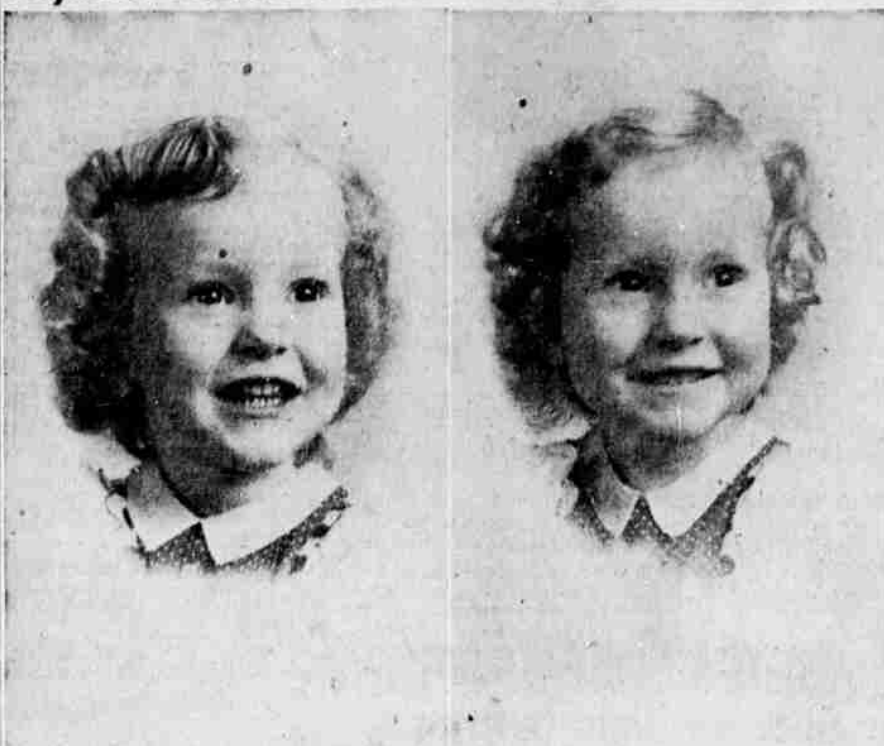
A DUV potluck dinner will be held Friday, June 6, at 6:30 p.m. at the home of Laverne Nickens, 1320 Ball St.

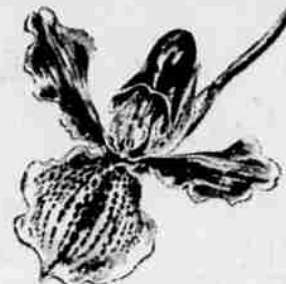
**WAGON WHEEL SQUARE
