Plans For United Fund Developed

Efforts of a group of public-advantage of a united fund-raising welfare program were developed at a meeting at the Chamber of Commerce rooms Thursday evening.

Representatives from laboring groups met with planners at the conference in an effort to reach mutual understanding and cooperation, one spokesman reports.
