

Drug Store Gunman Gets Money, Narcotics

PORTLAND (AP) — A gunman rifled a drug store safe of cash and narcotics Monday after forcing the proprietor to dial the combination. David Weiner, proprietor of the Nob Hill Pharmacy on N. W. Gilliam Street, was bound with shoelaces and he lay on the floor unable to call loud enough to attract attention of people standing just outside waiting for a bus. Finally he wiggled along until he was seen from outside and was released. He told police the gunman, wearing sunglasses, entered shortly after the store was opened, and at pistol point forced him to open the safe. The gunman, whose departure was not noticed by those outside, made off with three cloth sacs containing week end store receipts, as well as opium, cocaine and other drugs.

Two Roseburg winners at a regional roller-skating meet, held recently at Burlington, Wash., are to represent the whole Northwest at the North American Roller Skating Meet next month at Mammoth Gardens, Denver. They took first place in the May meet, which had competitors from four Northwest states and British Columbia. The pair also participated in an Oregon meet held at Portland in March. Although they were third-place winners in the Portland test, they were selected tops in the regional meet.

This marks the first time Oregon skaters have won the annual regional trophy. E. G. Erickson, their skating instructor, says.

Good Grammar Lacking In Grads Of High Schools

CAMBRIDGE, Mass. (AP) — The editor of the Atlantic monthly said Friday American boys graduating from high school do not "have in their bones" the essential structure of the ordinary American sentence.

Edward Weeks Jr. told the graduates of Massachusetts Institute of Technology that teaching of English in high schools has deteriorated to the point where better than average graduates cannot write with accuracy.

The editor, in a commencement address, said he had visited a good many colleges — the University of Maine, Ohio State, Wellesley and the University of Louisville — and that the "lament was the same."

The deficiency, he continued, is partly the result of "progressive education which has gone light on grammar, and which by use of the flash card system teaches students to identify words without knowing how to spell them."

He blamed also scholastic aptitude tests "which in the rush of the war discarded the essay type of examination with the result that students are graded for the accuracy of their facts, but they are not degraded for sloppy writing."

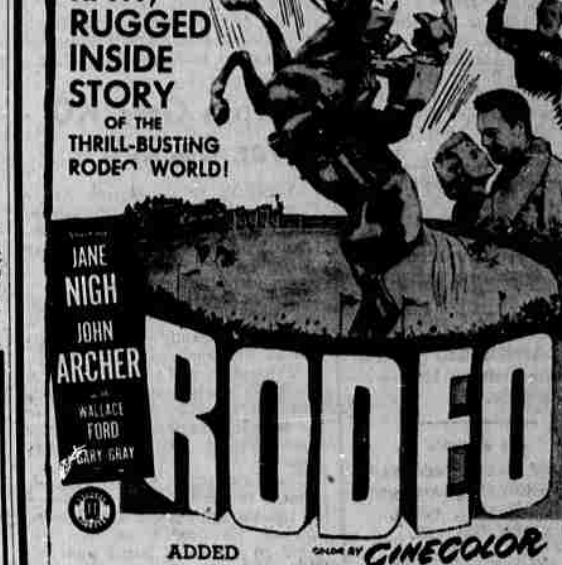
