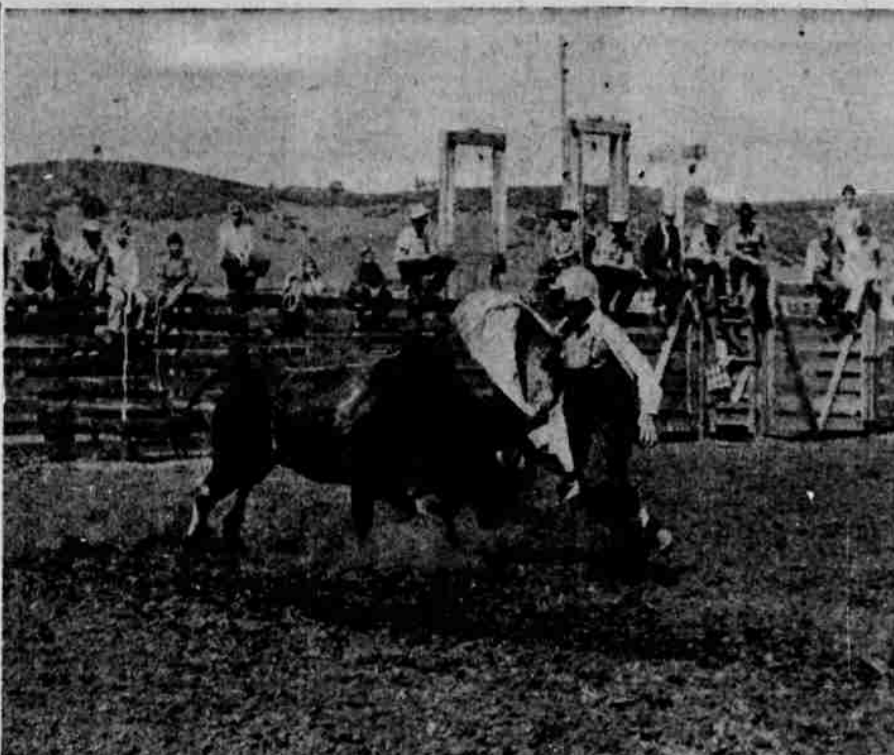

Oregon's Vets Bonds Money Invested

PORTLAND (AP) — State Treasurer Walter J. Pearson, back in Oregon after a trip to the east where he arranged for the sale of the state's veterans bonus bonds, said he had invested 25 million dollars from the sale in U. S. Treasury bonds.

The remainder of the \$44,977,256.55 he transferred equally to the First National and U. S. National Banks of Portland, he said.

Bonus checks, some of which will go in the mail to Oregon veterans this week, are expected to average about \$415 each.

Summer School Draws Douglas County 4-H'ers

Sixty excited Douglas County 4-H'ers, with bags and bedrolls, will leave by bus Tuesday, June 17, for the 1952 4-H Summer School June 17 to 27 at Oregon State College.

An expected 1,800 youngsters will participate in the fun and frolic of the 10-day session. Each of those attending from this county are on a scholarship program provided by interested organizations, businesses, and individuals.

The Oregon Bankers Association will present a variety show June 24. This is the annual Bankers Day, when bankers and their wives throughout the state are invited to visit 4-H Summer School, attend classes and assembly programs, and eat with the 4-H'ers.

The 1952 Radio revue is scheduled for the evening of June 25. KOAC, State station at Corvallis, will broadcast special Summer school features all during the school session. Farewell parties in the living units will wind up the 1952 4-H summer school with a flourish June 26.
