"MGM Theatre of the Air." The 1952 All-Star Baseball Game, to be played Tuesday, July 8, in Philadelphia's Shibe Park, is to be broadcast for the ninth year as an exclusive Mutual-Don Lee Network sports feature.

The play-by-play account of this 19th meeting between all-star players of both major leagues is another in the "Gillette Cavalcade of Sports" series. The entire coast-to-coast will be linked for the game. Air time is set at 10:15 a.m., 15 minutes prior to the umpire's "play ball" cry.

Armed Forces Radio Services will beam the description by short-wave to our occupation troops overseas and to naval ships at sea. In addition, the game is to be short-waved to Cuba and other Latin American countries.

The annual All-Star series — which pits stellar performers of the American League against similarly outstanding players of the National League — started in 1933. Only one game, the 1945 contest, had to be cancelled because of war-time travel restrictions. The American League has won 12 of the 18 games played.
