Russia To Push Germ War Claim At U.N. Session

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y. (AP)—Russia's Jacob A. Malik Monday called a meeting of the United Nations Security Council for Wednesday at 3 p. m. (11 a. m. Pst.) to discuss Soviet charges that the U. N. is carrying on germ warfare in Korea.

The Soviet Union thus apparently decided to air its charges of germ warfare in the Security Council after failing to obtain any action in the U. N. Disarmament Commission.

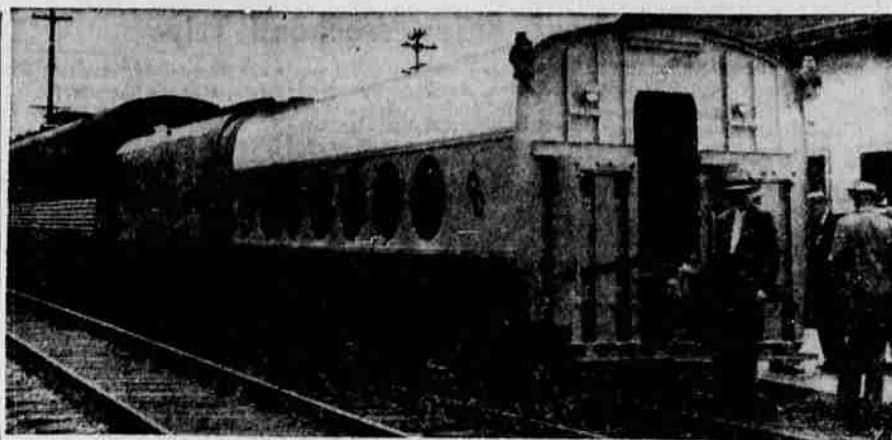
The United States and other U. N. countries have repeatedly denied such charges and have in fact challenged Malik to take such action.

Malik, June chairman of the 11-nation Security Council, also placed on the agenda of this meeting the issue of new members. The great powers were asked by the U. N. Assembly in Paris to reconsider the applications of 14 countries. This step is in response to that request. There has been no change in the stalemate on new members.

Malik's decision to call this meeting recalled his dramatic series of council meetings in August, 1950, when the Korean War was the hot issue.

Nothing was done by the council during that month, except argue, and the council eventually dropped the Korean War from its agenda.

Malik startled the world in March this year with his violent charges that the United Nations was waging germ warfare in Korea and China.

Conscription Facing People Of E. Germany

BERLIN (AP)—Communist-run East Germany prepared Tuesday a law for conscription of a "people's army" and for punishment of conscientious objectors as "enemies of peace."

Apparently this is a trump card of the Russians in a move to force the Western Powers into a Big Four conference that might delay and strain the Western defense program.

East Germany's 18 million people were told in an announcement by "the anti-Fascist Democratic bloc" of parties—the Communist-dominated bloc of the East Zone,

that "whoever is not ready to take up arms against the attacker of peace encourages the attacker and endangers peace."

Already in Berlin, women are being dragooned to do the work of men, so that the men will be freed for army conscription. Women are being used as street car operators in East Berlin.

And the West Berlin newspaper Der Tag reported the East Berlin Communists are preparing to cut West Berlin's sewer lines at the boundary dividing it from the city's Russian-occupied sector.

Most of the Western sewage passes through the Red sector and into the surrounding Russian Zone for disposal.

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Truck's Trailer Drops Over Cliff

A spectacular accident Saturday morning on the North Umpqua highway near Mc's place, provided thrills for the onlookers. According to eye witnesses Harry Bakken and Walter Tolles, an empty logging truck with an eight-wheel trailer had turned north from the highway onto a side-road to obtain a load of logs.

The steep side-road was muddy and slippery from the week's rain and the truck started slipping backwards, the driver unable to control it with his brakes. Back across the highway, it rolled, and the trailer went over a sheer rock cliff, 75-foot drop, hanging perilously for scant minutes.

Down below, at the foot of the

cliff, was a power shovel of the Funderburk Construction Co. with a crew of four men. Shouts of other workmen alerted them to their peril; a mechanic underneath the shovel was said to have crawled out in nothing flat to run with the other men to safety. Then the reach on the trailer broke and the 2½-ton trailer dropped over the cliff, crashed into the power shovel and bounced into the air before falling on its side, telescoping the 25-foot reach under the chassis.

Funderburk's caterpillar tractor reached the logging truck whose rear wheels were over the edge of the cliff, and pulled it safely back on the highway. The name of the truck driver could not be obtained.

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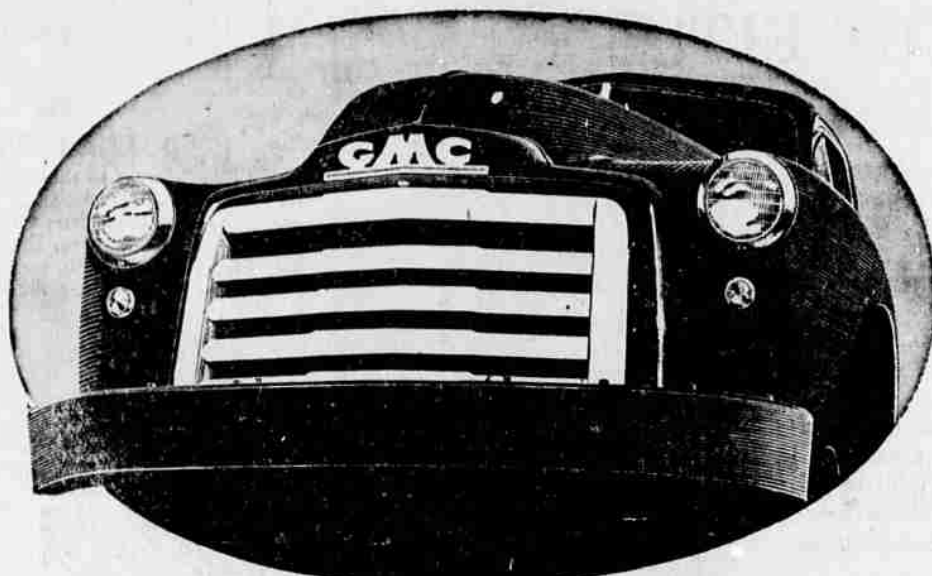
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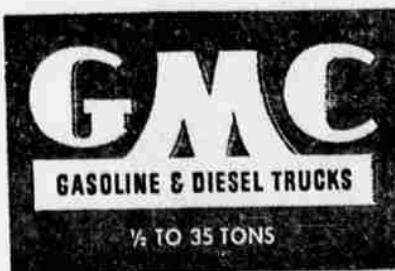
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
