

Germ Warfare Denial By Ridgway Emphatic

ROME (AP) — Gen. Matthew B. Ridgway, in a blistering denial of Communist propaganda claims, Tuesday said "as God is my witness, germ warfare has never been used by the United Nations forces in Korea."

The new SHAPE commander said: "I know of no better illustration of the deliberate use of deliberately fabricated falsehood by Communist leadership than their charges that the United Nations command employed germ warfare in Korea."

Ridgway was speaking at an air port news conference shortly before taking off for Naples.

Communist threats of demonstrations against Ridgway, dubbed by the Reds "General Plague" — fizzled out during his two-day visit in the Italian capital.

Allies Hold Hill Against Series Of Red Attacks

SEOUL, Korea (AP) — Chinese Communists Tuesday shot off their big guns at probably the fastest clip of the Korean War. They failed to budge United Nations infantrymen defending a T-shaped knobby hill.

A battalion of about 750 Chinese struck at the hill three times in 2½ hours and were turned back each time by bayonet wielding U. N. doughboys standing fast at the bottom.

The six-day-old fight for the Western Front high point near Chorwon is the biggest and bloodiest of the war since January. Allied troops won a foothold on the humpy formation last Thursday. They now hold three of its rocky knobs. The Reds have been counterattacking bitterly.

An Allied officer at the front said the Reds have lost more than 1,000 killed and wounded in the fight for hill T and that Red dead are "still piled up."

Railway Strike Causes Huge Commuter Jam

NEW YORK (AP) — The Long Island Railroad, shut down by an engineers' strike creating one of the metropolitan area's biggest commuter traffic jams, Tuesday tightened a freight embargo on its 400 miles of line.

For more than a million persons on Long Island, who depend directly or indirectly on the busy line, there appeared no indication of an immediate settlement of the walk-out, now in its second day.

Federal efforts to settle the dispute broke down Monday night when representatives of the Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineers walked out of a meeting called by Ross Barr, a mediator for the National Mediation Board.

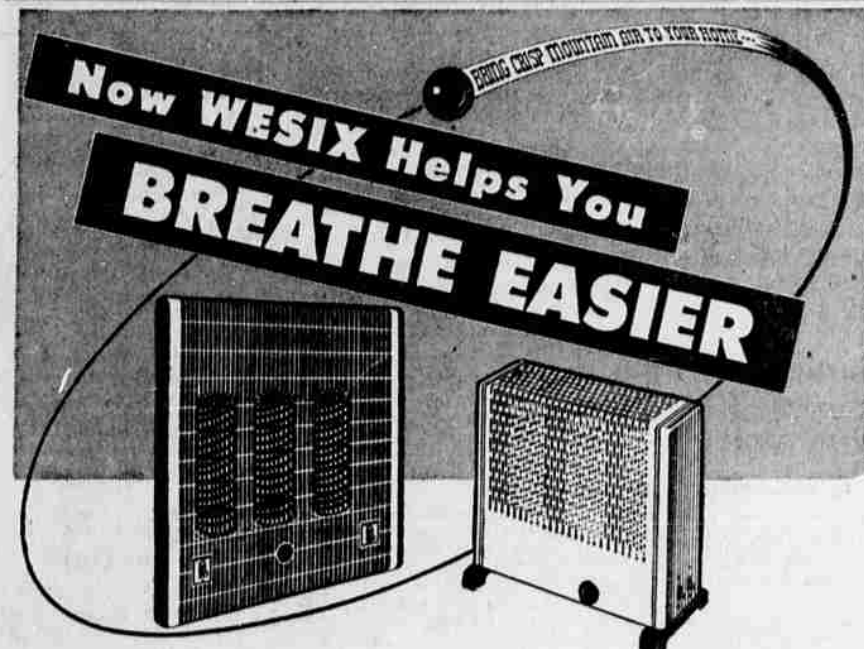
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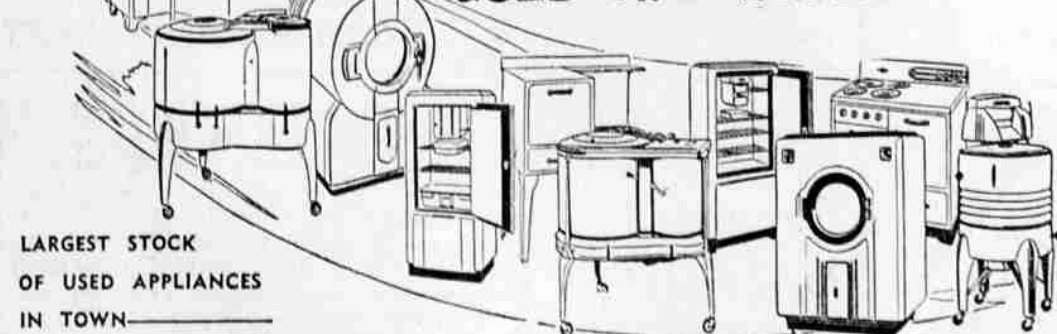
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
