U.S. Boxers Seek Olympic Berths

KANSAS CITY (AP) — The pressure is on the heavyweights and lightweights as Uncle Sam's rugged amateur boxers square off Wednesday night for berths in next month's world Olympic games at Helsinki.

Ten semi-final scraps will precede the championship windup in Municipal Auditorium. All the champions qualify for the U.S. Olympic team. Four alternates will be chosen by officials from the losers participating here.

Of the four quarterfinal heavy-weight bouts Tuesday night, only one went the scheduled three rounds and chances are the champion will be one of this country's best Olympic weapons.

Edward Sanders of Los Angeles, representing the all-Navy team, scored a sensational first round knockout over heavyweight Lloyd Willis, the Midwest regional king, in 1:31 of the first round. He avenged a knockout loss to Willis in the first round of the regionals at Omaha, Nebr., two weeks ago.

Frank Echevarria, Idaho University's NCAA champion from Blackfoot, takes on hard hitting David Moore, Springfield, O., for the 119 pound title. Echevarria, who had easy sailing his first two starts, barely beat Sam Rollins, New York. Moore had a wide margin over Richardo Martinez, Los Angeles.

Other bouts Wednesday night include Ellsworth Webb, NCAA champion from Idaho State College against Ernest Anthony of New York in the 156-pound class, and Gordon Gladson of Washington State versus Bryant Thompson of Philadelphia, 165 pounds.

Golf Biggies Tee Off For PGA Trophy

LOUISVILLE (AP) — The tournament of upsets, the PGA championship, gets under way Wednesday and one of the safest bets in golf is that a lot of golfers who have been grabbing the headlines will be out of it by Saturday night.

And Saturday is only the halfway point in the week-long grind, consisting of two 18-hole qualifying rounds and five rounds of match play.

Most of the big names of the tournament circuit are in the field, although they had to change the rules to invite open champion Julius Boros.

But primarily the tournament is the private party of the rank and file of the Professional Golfers Association—the guys who stay at home teaching golf instead of following the more glamorous tournament trail.

While players like Boros, defending champion Sam Snead, hot-and-cold Lloyd Mangrum, Porky Oliver and Cary Middlecoff draw most of the attention, the field is loaded with little-known players who can shoot a round or two of great golf.

And one round is all that's needed to eliminate a favorite on the first day of match play. After the 36 holes of qualifying, the 64 survivors go into two 18-hole rounds of "sudden death" match play on Friday.

From there on the matches are over the more conclusive 36-hole distance. But often that's too late for the stars.
