Union Turns Down Strike Fund Plan

CLEVELAND (AP) — Disagreeing
mainly on how it should be estab-
lished, delegates to the annual
convention of the Communications
Workers of America (CIO) have

turned down a plan for a 12 million
dollar strike fund.

As submitted in a committee re-
port, the plan was to raise from
\$1.50 to \$2.00 the amount per mem-
ber paid by each local union to the
international union each
month. This would have contained \$50
for each member. When the fund
dipped to \$40 a member, the levy
would have been renewed.

Debate on the question turned al-
most entirely on the method of
creating the fund. Little objection
was heard to the idea of raising
money.

President Joseph A. Beirne had
described the strike fund as the
main issue of the convention's
business.

Kiwanis Scores Truman's Order On Information

SEATTLE (AP) — Kiwanis Inter-
national, heading into the fi-
nal day of its five-day 37th annual
convention, wrote into its records
a hard hitting resolution calling
for freedom of information in this
country.

The resolution was one of 19
adopted by the 10,000 delegates
Wednesday after electing Walter
J. L. Ray, Detroit, as new presi-
dent.

New York City also was without
opposition in its bid for the 1953
convention.

In a direct slap at President
Truman's order last year empow-
ering federal agencies to classify
their own information on security
grounds, the resolution said Ki-
wanis International "demands the
right of freedom of information be
continued as a fundamental right
of all the people."

It said "some public officials feel
they are not accountable to the pub-
lic, particularly in the handling of
information of non-defense depart-
ments; that they may conduct the
business of their offices in secret;
that they may seal or impound
public records; that they may di-
vulge only such information as

they think is good for the people
to know; and that they may ex-
tend military security into areas
which have no bearing on that
security."

The resolution said further that
Kiwanis International "vigorously
condemns all such practices, and
denounces the misuse of official
influence and power."

A controversial resolution on uni-
versal military training was re-
ferred back to the resolutions com-
mittee for action next year.

GIRL CONQUERS POLIO

DALLAS (AP) — Nancy K. Reilly,
13, a 7th grade pupil, suffered a
polio attack last October which
forced her out of school.

She was flat on her back in
bed for three months. Nancy hated
to be left behind a semester so
after she regained use of her arms
and hands following treatment ad-
ministered by her mother, she
began studying again.

Neither her teacher nor her
classmates could visit her. In
spite of this Nancy graduated re-
cently from her elementary school
with high grades.

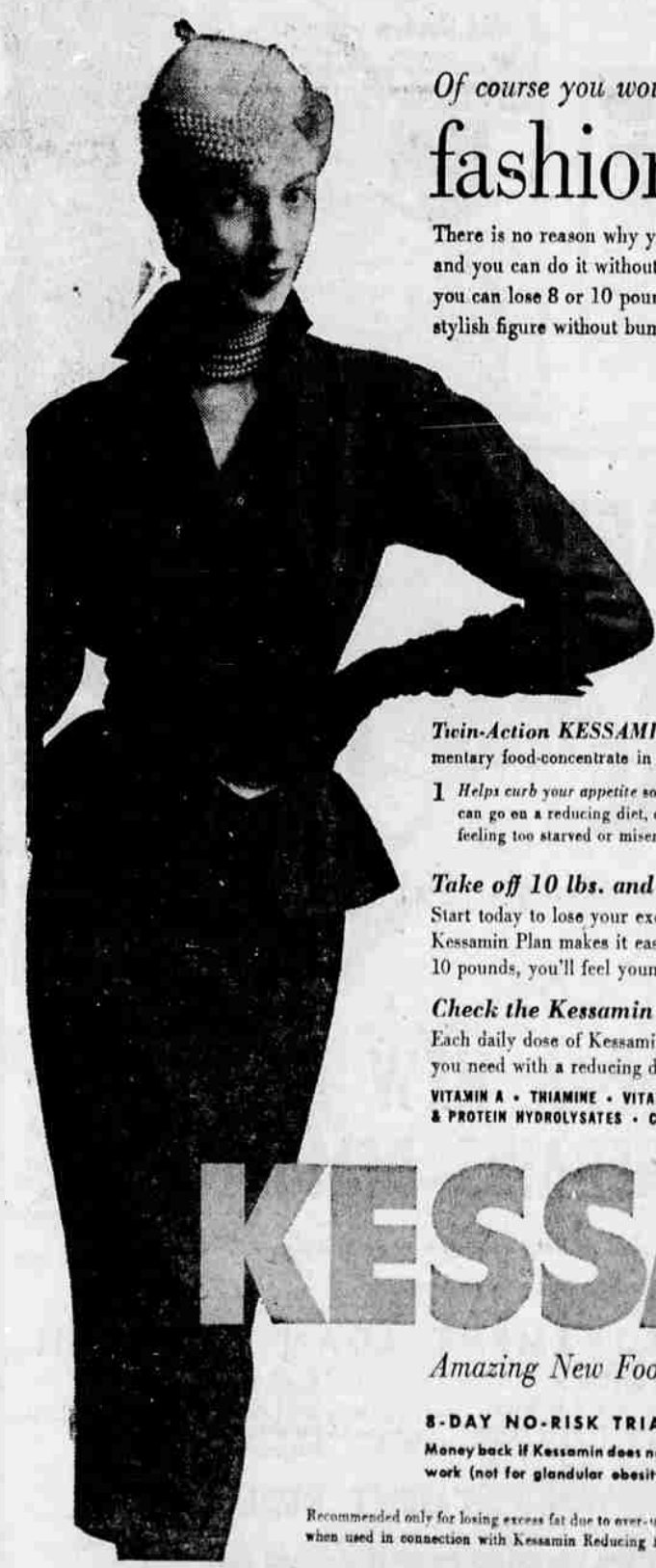
