

Brooklyn Blanks Chi Bruins, 5-0

The boys who know baseball best have been saying for some time that when Carl Erskine learned to control the ball consistently he would be a great pitcher.

The 25-year-old Brooklyn right hander from Anderson, Ind., apparently has learned that lesson. If he hasn't there were a lot of people, including the Chicago Cubs, badly fooled Thursday as he faced only 28 men while holding the Bruins hitless for a 5-0 Dodger victory.

And the only thing that kept him from pitching the first perfect game since Charlie Robertson of the Chicago White Sox retired 27 Detroit Tigers in 1922 was a walk to opposing pitcher Willie Ramsdell in the third inning.

Rain started falling a few minutes later and the game was held up for 45 minutes. But Erskine came back even stronger.

Erskine's feat high - lighted a day of top flight pitching performances.

Philadelphia's pint - sized Bobby Shantz racked up his 11th successive victory and his 12th of the season as the Athletics divided a doubleheader with the Chicago White Sox, winning 4-1 and losing 5-4.

Allie Reynolds, the big New York Yankee right hander who shuns help from relief pitchers, hurled his third shutout of the year and his 15th consecutive complete game in blanking the Detroit Tigers, 8-0.

Ivan DeLoach, whose regular chore with the Boston Red Sox is relief pitching, held the St. Louis Browns to five scattered hits to record his third victory, 2-0.

Little Murry Dickson of the Pittsburgh Pirates also twirled five-hit balls as the cellar-dwelling Bucs defeated the New York Giants 8-1 in an argument - studied game played under protest after the third inning. The defeat dropped the Giants five games back of the Dodgers.

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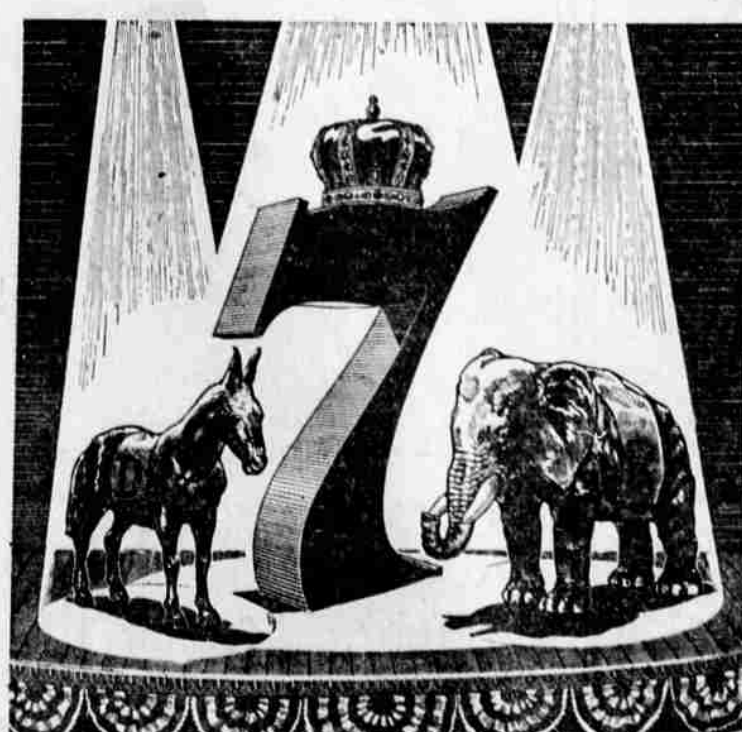
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
