 Portland's veteran Red Adams turned in the Pacific Coast Thursday night, and Bill Sweeney's League's top pitching performance Seattle Rainiers continued to advance on the top rung clubs.
 A crowd of 10,150 at Los Angeles saw Adams hurl Portland to a 6 to 0 win over the power-laden Angels.
 Adams whiffed seven and was in complete charge of the situation, while the Beavers collected 11 hits, including homers by Joe Brovia and Don Eggert, off three Los Angeles choppers.
 Portland seems to be the Los Angeles nemesis, for the Angels have beaten the Oregon outfit only twice in eight starts.

Lawyer Denies Drew Pearson's Assault Charge

WASHINGTON — Charles Patrick Clark, who tossed a straight left at columnist Drew Pearson in the Mayflower Hotel lobby, pleaded innocent to charges of assault Thursday.
 Clark, an attorney, was released in police court on personal bond for a hearing July 3.
 Pearson was not in court. He was represented by his counsel.
 Clark, 37, 5-foot-11, a-year lobbyist, has freely admitted to reporters that he threw the punch Wednesday.
 "I felt I'd be unfaithful to my Irish forebears," Clark told reporters, "if I didn't do something."
 The one-blow encounter between the columnist - commentator and his critic - who, in turn, had been raked over the coals twice in Pearson's column - occurred after lunch in the lobby of the fashionable hotel.
 Pearson, 54, weighs 175 pounds. Clark is 44, weighs around 180.

GRANTS PASS, Ore. — A 19-month-old boy, sought in timbered mountains by 200 searchers, was found scratched, crying, but unharmed three miles from where he vanished Wednesday afternoon.
 The boy, William Gillaspie Jr., was found by Mr. and Mrs. Bud Turnbough who live in the area. Another resident, Mrs. Lester Adams, said that although the child appeared to have been crying a good deal and was badly scratched, he seemed to be unharmed by his ordeal.
 He had been missing some 20 hours after leaving playmates on a trail bridge over Thompson Creek, south of here.
