In turn his children were prominent as lawyers and educational leaders. Mrs. Beckley closed with a discussion "What Makes a Missionary."

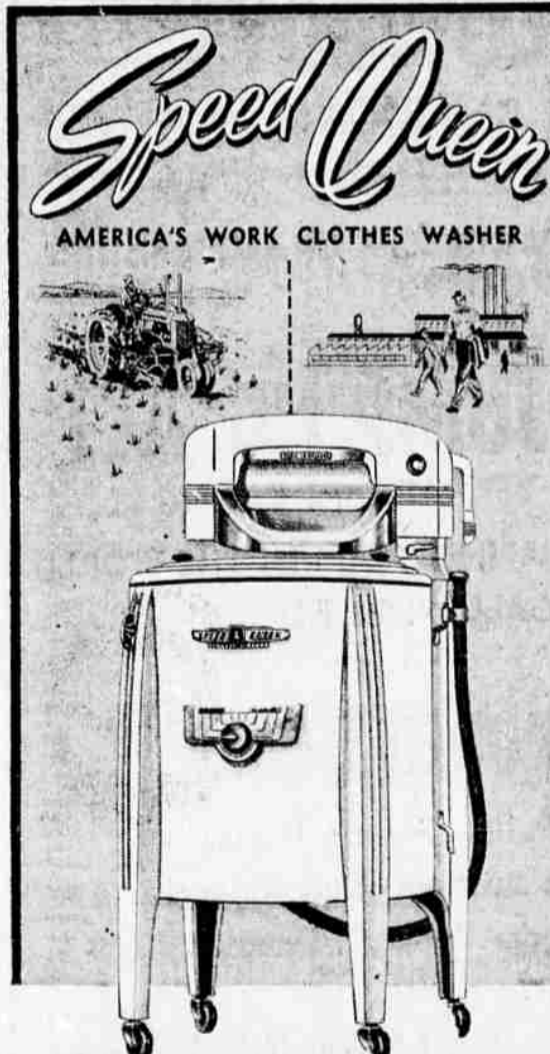
