cessories. Her corsage was of white carnations. The bridegroom's mother wore a light brown suit with dark brown accessories. Her corsage was of white carnations.

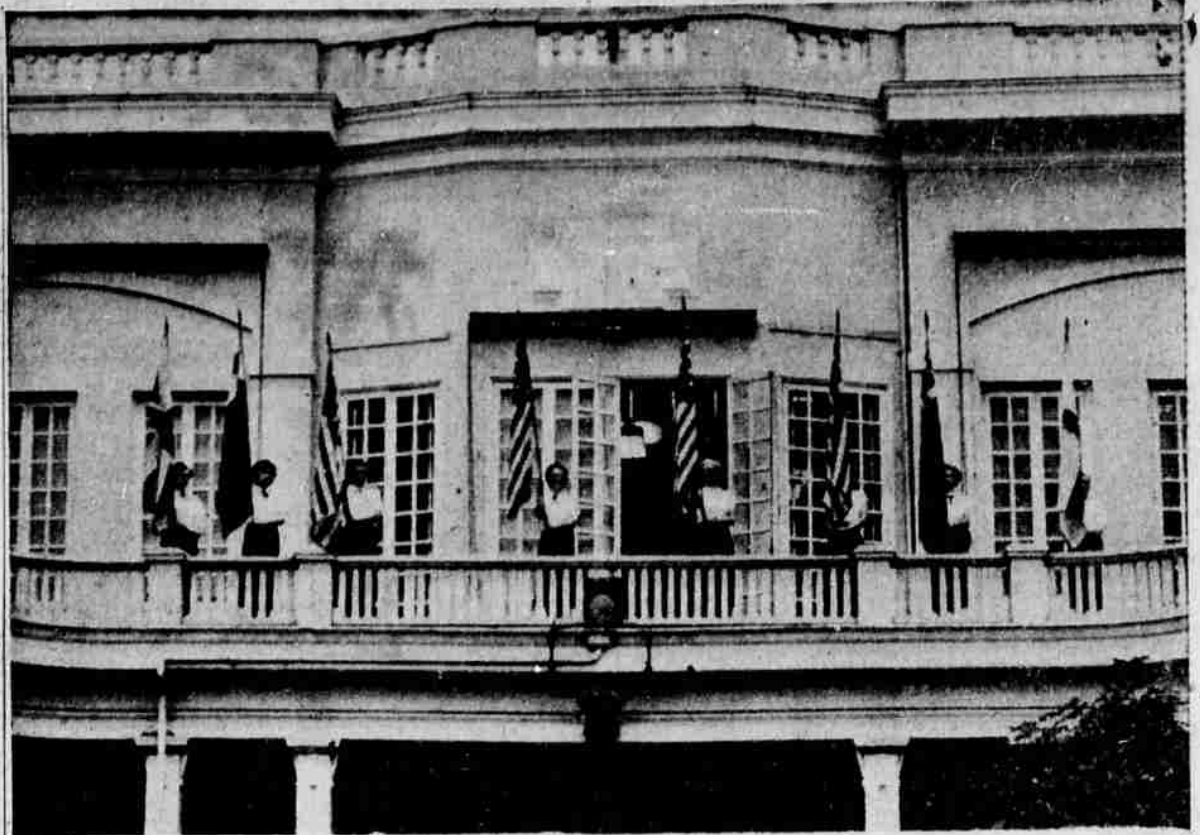
For their honeymoon trip to San Francisco, the bride chose to wear a white suit with red accessories.
