A young people's Bible conference will be held at Camp Tye next week, under sponsorship of the American Sunday School Union.

The conference will begin Monday, with the first meal to be served to the estimated 60 to 70 young people who will be attending Monday at 6 p.m. The session will continue through the following Sunday afternoon.

Rev. Arthur Kelstrup, local missionary for the American Sunday School Union, will be camp supervisor and will be conducting some of the class sessions.

District Superintendent Raymond P. Targgart, Portland, will be camp speaker for the evening sessions, and will also assist with the other meetings.

The program calls for Bible studies during the forenoon, with recreation in the afternoon and evening camp meetings. In addition to Targgart's evening talks, special motion pictures will be shown every night, said Rev. Mr. Kelstrup.

Registrations for the camp will be at the Douglas County rural Sunday Schools sponsored by the union. The youths must be 11 years or older.

Camp assistants will also include Mrs. Kelstrup, and Rev. Kelstrup's brother, Ray Kelstrup from Belingham will be present to assist with instructions and supervise athletics and be lifeguard at the swimming pool. His wife will also attend.
