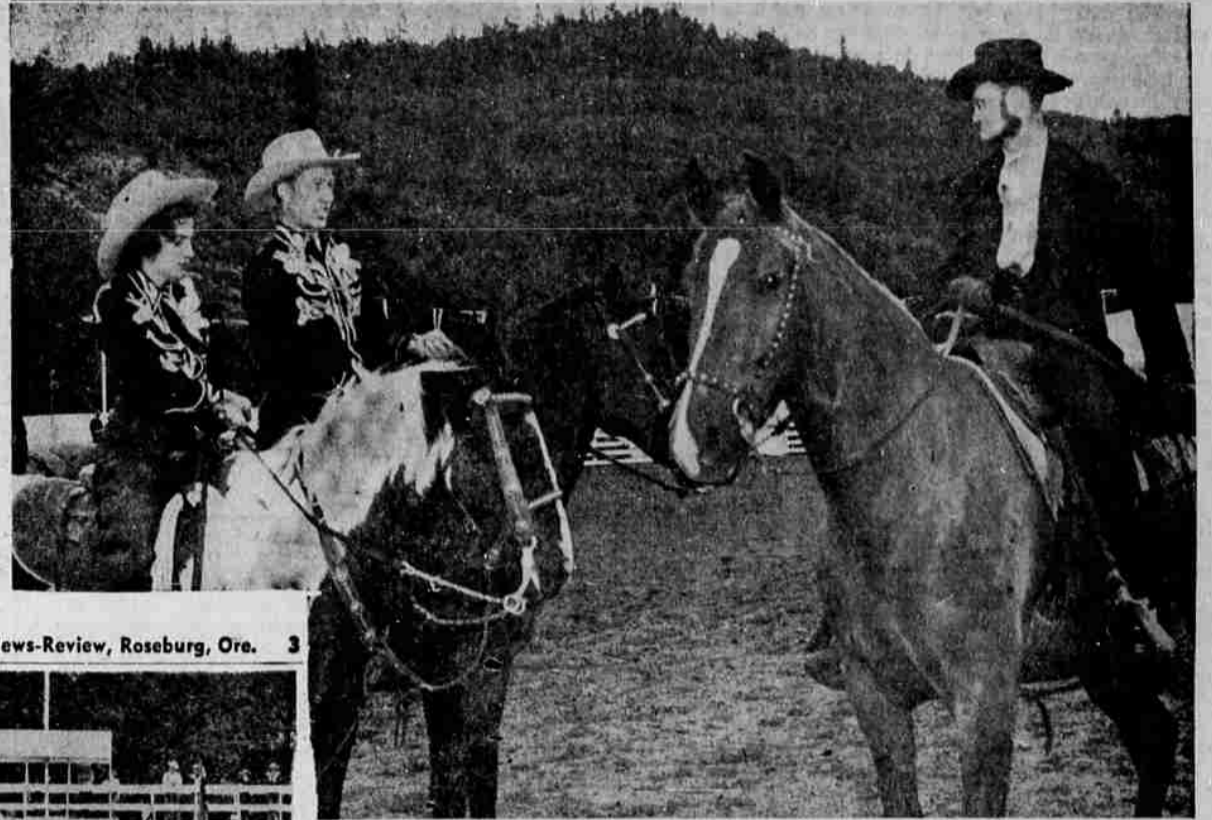
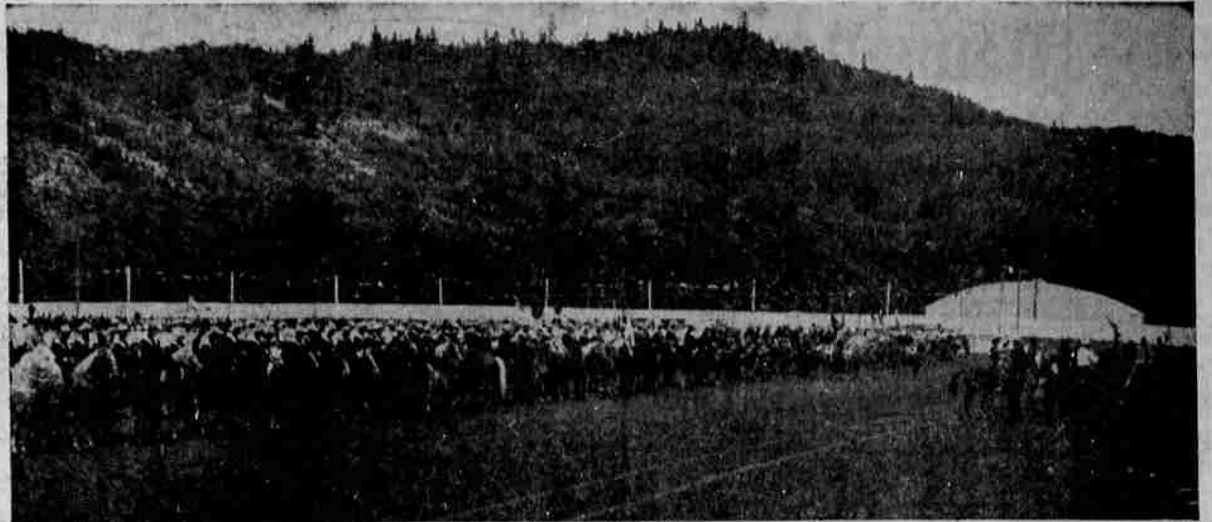
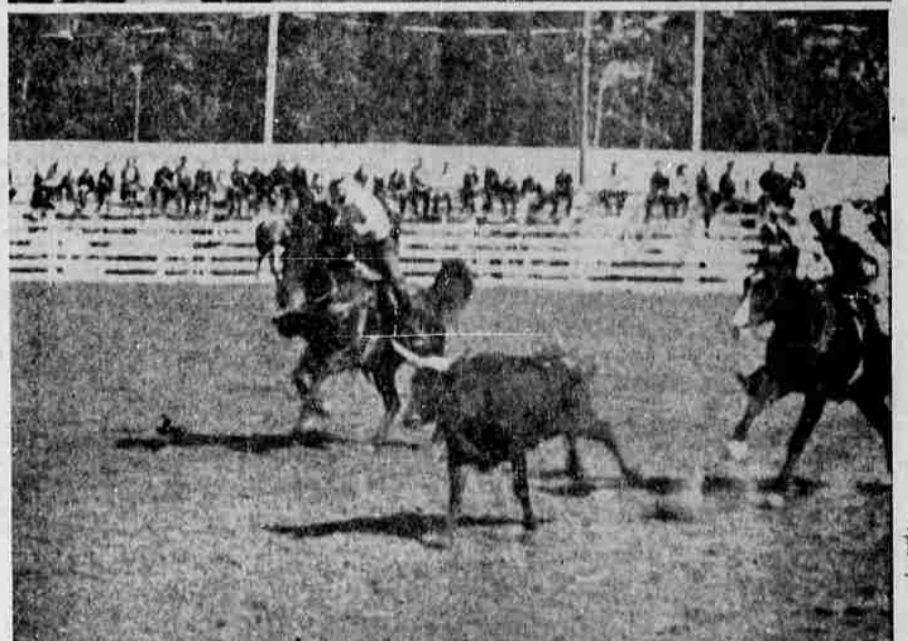


# Roseburg Celebrates Rodeo Days
