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Independents Led In Grocery Trade, Assn. Head Says

MIAMI, Fla. (AP) — Independent stores handled almost two thirds of the nation's grocery business, President Gerard Klomp of the National Association of Retail Grocers said Monday.

In a speech prepared for the grocers' annual convention, Klomp said recent surveys showed that independent retailers have mastered the techniques of business so well they handle up to 85 per cent of the total food sales in some cities.

"Figures like that really are eyebrow raisers," Klomp said, "especially to those business prognosticators of a few years back who shook their heads sadly over the fate of the independent grocer and said it wouldn't be long before they'd all be out of business."

"The chain stores work hard to hang on to 37.7 per cent of the total grocery store volume. They have shown no perceptible gains in 20 years, while many independent grocers have shown rather startling gains."

Klomp, from Ogden, Utah, said the 75,000 independent retail grocers would spend \$800,000,000 in 1952 to modernize and expand their stores.

Seven out of each 100 plan to build new stores this year, he said, and 28 per cent will remodel their

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N.W. Fall Railway Car Need Put At 250,000

SPOKANE (AP) — The Pacific Northwest will need more than a quarter of a million railroad cars in the third quarter of this year to haul its products to market, the Northwest Advisory Board estimated Tuesday.

Pete Stallcop, the board's vice president, said an estimated 274,285 cars will be needed as compared with 271,235 actually used during the third quarter of 1951.

Lumber and forest products will require by far the most with an estimated total of 173,055, up 3.5 per cent. Grain will require 16,876, a drop of 12 per cent, and fresh fruits 5,989, up 10.5 per cent, he said.
